Jean Jukes

Jean started quilling when she retired at the age of 57. She had always enjoyed spending time doing handicrafts eg crochet work and embroidery so quilling was a natural hobby for her to start. Jean taught herself and found the art came easily to her, so much so that when she joined a quilling course the tutor couldn't really teach her anything new! However, Jean enjoyed meeting like-minded people so continued to attend the sessions. Over the years she has made many pieces including presents for all her family. In 1999 Jean became the UK National

Champion with a beautiful piece of quilling that her husband, Brian, framed for her.

Quilling, also known as paper filigree, is an art form in which strips of paper are used to create various decorative designs that are rolled, shaped and glued together. Jean creates all her own designs, and doesn't even draw them on paper as a guideline. Each piece can take ten hours to complete so patience is needed with this hobby! The name quilling is thought to come from the origin of the art, as traditionally birds' feathers, or quills, were used to coil the strips of paper around.



Your Oddfellows – How it works

Deeside Oddfellows Branch currently delivers its services through the management team, which comprises of the Trustees, Secretary together with the Committee of Management. We are assisted by our Staff and Volunteers.

The Committee of Management is made up of the three Trustees who are elected to be responsible for legal and financial activity and to guide the Management Committee. Currently the Trustees are Brothers John Williams, Meirion Edwards and Gordon Hinett. Also four Branch Officers who are the Provincial Grand Master who acts as Chairman Brother Gordon Hinett, Provincial Deputy Grand Master who acts as Vice-Chairman Sister Olwen Bellis and Immediate Past Provincial Grand Master Sister Tracey Edwards. The Social organiser also sits on the Committee along with up to two elected members who are Brothers Richard Spain and Stewart Holmes.

We are responsible for Benevolence and Welfare of all our members, including home visits, convalescence and support grants. Volunteer Welfare Visitors are trained and subject to DBS checks. We have recently appointed Tracey Edwards as our Safeguarding Officer. The Branch also administers optical and dental benefits for qualifying members. We run a social programme which is open to all members and non-members.

The Branch covers North Wales, Wirral, Chester and parts of Cheshire and meets monthly.

The meetings follow the tradition of the Oddfellows and are open to Members and guests.

In keeping with our traditions we operate 10 of our meetings as a 'Lodge Meetings' this enables us to practice our ritual and prepare members for progression to Branch level.

The elected officers in the 'Lodge' include the Noble Grand Sister June Middleton who acts as Chairman, Vice Grand Brother Richard Spain who acts as Vice Chairman, Elective Secretary who takes the Minutes and Immediate Past Noble Grand Sister Val Jones.

Fundraising for Ukraine

The Society is collecting donations to support the work the Red Cross is doing in Ukraine. The Red Cross is part of the Disasters Emergency Committee (DEC), which unites 15 member charities who are experts in humanitarian aid and specialists in different areas of disaster response.

Access to expert legal help

From day one of membership, all members have access to the Oddfellows' Legal Aid Scheme.*

We hope it's something you never have to call on, but if you do it gives you access to the expert help of our appointed solicitors should you need to make a claim for medical negligence, a personal injury, or an employment dispute which is at pre or tribunal stage. It also covers your family members for personal injury and medical negligence cases.

Help with a medical negligence claim

Medical negligence is when a healthcare provider – NHS or private – has failed in their duty to take care of you and you have suffered an injury. This could be, for example, that you've been given a wrong drug, they've made a mistake during a treatment, or failed to diagnose your condition, or made a wrong one.

Matthew Heap, a Solicitor and Partner at CL Medilaw (www.clmedilaw.co.uk), which is one of the Society's approved solicitors, further explained: "Some people get in touch with us and they know the exact point at which they feel they've been failed. For others, it's less clear-cut, but they know that somewhere along the line, the care they've received has fallen short of medically-acceptable standards.

"Knowing how to raise your case, and to be heard, can be daunting when you don't know the process, have the contacts, or legal knowledge.

"But the support that's available through the Oddfellows' Legal Aid Scheme can help you to get the answers you need and, hopefully, the compensation you deserve."

Who can make a claim?

You can bring the legal action yourself or, as the executor or next of kin, on behalf of someone who has died because of medical negligence, or on behalf of a family member if that person is unable to take action themselves because they don't have capacity.

Oddfellows members and their family can receive Legal Aid Scheme support as long as the accident, incident or issue happened while you were a member and you have remained a member since that time.

You must start your legal claim within three years from the date that you either realised you'd been injured or when the incident occurred. For children, this three-year time limit doesn't start until the child's 18th birthday.

If you're looking to make a claim on behalf of someone close to you because they don't have capacity, such as they're unable to manage their own affairs or have a mental disability, then the three-year time limit doesn't apply, unless they recover from this incapacity.

"Taking legal action for compensation is a way to try and secure the support that you now need and deserve – financial or medical. The Oddfellows and CL Medilaw will have your back every step of the way," added Matthew.

How to apply for the Oddfellows' Legal Aid Scheme

The first step is to call the Care and Welfare Helpline for a non-committal conversation. If you wish to move forward, you'll need to fill in an Oddfellows Legal Aid application form. The Care and Welfare Helpline number can be found on your membership card or by calling **0800 028 1810**.
