'Hello' to Katrina

Editor: We are so thrilled to welcome Katrina as our new Social Organiser – here are a few introductory words from her...

I'm very excited to have been offered the position at Oddfellows, Concord Branch, as Branch Development and Events Organiser. Organising events is my passion and I'm excited to be involved in this industry again.

I have lived around Farnham all my life and went to school at Frensham Heights. I had many hobbies at school, athletics, poetry, art, acting, reading to name but a few. I have always loved a good party from an early age, perhaps this began my journey into organising events.

I have had a diverse professional career, having begun a job as a Financial Adviser when I first moved to London, before moving into a field sales role. I absolutely loved this but it wasn't my passion. In the evenings I was working on setting up an Events Company, which I ran after having my two eldest children.

Moving back to Farnham 20 years ago, with my then 4 children, now ages 27,26,24, and 20, they are like boomerangs. I never seem to get rid of more than 2 at a time, so there is certainly never a dull moment, but I wouldn't change it just yet!

In 2008 I set up a charity called 'Over the Moon Foundation', helping families with autistic and disabled children. I ran this for 10 years and it was truly an amazing experience watching how the charity grew, and meeting all the great kids we helped. It was hugely rewarding seeing how grateful each family was for our



help. A few years ago, I handed this over to my colleague, and it is still thriving.

Recently I qualified as an NLP Practitioner, Life Coach and Mentor which is a business I will run alongside my part-time job with Concord.

I have qualified success as an Event Planner and possess an organised and detail-oriented work ethic which I will bring to the role. I have been a senior Event Coordinator and have planned over 50 different events from Balls, discos, Halloween parties, Christmas parties, flower arranging, wreath making, sponsored walks, sponsored bike rides, quizzes etc. I have overseen all aspects of event planning, from finding appropriate venues to selecting print, media etc. There is nothing that makes me happier than seeing an event well planned and executed.

I am very much looking forward to getting stuck into this role and excited to meet all the members, volunteers and everybody involved in Oddfellows which makes it an amazing society to be involved with.

The sky was blue and the sun was shining for this one of our first face to face get-togethers after lockdown – members were delighted to be able to sit outside and enjoy the warmth of friendship once more. We were delighted to be joined by some lovely folk who saw our event advertised on Meetup.

'Goodbye' to Kristen

A huge hello to all my dear friends and members! If you did not already know, the four of us successfully moved to San Antonio. Texas. towards the end of June 2021 – after only being awarded a visa status two weeks earlier. My husband and I have always wanted to live in America, but had given up hope that it would ever become a reality for us. That was until we met a Scottish helicopter pilot in 2019 who explained all about the E2 investment visa that brought him to the US. Fast forward two vears and we have not only survived Covid-19, but also sold our house and all our belongings in the UK and relocated to America.

We spent the first 5 weeks in a furnished house, to then move to a brand new rental place with nothing but blinds. For the first week or so we only had one bar stool and one recliner chair, no washing machine, no sofas, no storage and no TV! Somehow we survived the ordeal to live another day and still with a smile on our faces.





Whilst it might seem crazy to move so promptly after arriving, for us it was absolutely the right thing to do, as we now live in a lovely gated community, with not one but two local gated pools and a highly rated new elementary school that can accommodate both Peyton and Chloe. All of this located roughly half a mile from the house!





Thankfully both Peyton and Chloe have taken the move in their stride and Chloe – at age 5 – is already talking like an American! Peyton hasn't yet acclimatised to the heat, but with the endless splash pads and waterparks nearby he is well catered for. Personally my favourite aspect of our new place is the sunset that occurs every night opposite our house, beautifully visible from our walk in closet and veranda. We are friends with two couples who have made the move so much easier for us – not only have they assisted with moving furniture, providing laundry services, but also gifting us with season passes to the local six flags theme park. As an avid theme park fan, I am thrilled that San Antonio has a six flags theme park, a SeaWorld theme park and a theme park dedicated to people with special needs. As a mum of a special needs child, it is refreshing to be in a town that is so accommodating.

Ally now has a social security number but unfortunately I will have to wait up to eight months for mine – not ideal when I was anticipating the wait to be a maximum of three months! This means I can't get a job until well into next year. Not something we had counted on when we were working out the finances until Christmas. We also haven't yet managed to get a Texas driver's license, but hope it will happen before Halloween.

We always knew that setting up a life in America for us and our children wouldn't be without its' challenges, but we are so thrilled that we took the gamble. We are finally living the American dream and couldn't be happier.
