A message from Denise and Caroline


Welcome to the latest edition of our Out & About. We hope that you enjoy browsing through it and reading the articles and are able to engage in some of the activities we have planned.

We would like to share with you some interesting information about the Deeside District Lodge or the more modern terminology Deeside District Branch.

Established in 1867 the Deeside area is a vast area covering approximately 5,500 square miles and stretches from Wirral along the North Wales coast incorporating Anglesey, parts of Wales as far as Barmouth, across to Wrexham, Chester and parts of Cheshire.

Many years ago there would have been a 'Lodge' in nearly every town or larger village forming the Deeside District. Gradually many of these merged or ceased as numbers declined due to the introduction of the National Health Service and Welfare State, as we weren't needed as much by our members. Then in 2001 the Deeside District amalgamated to form the Deeside District Lodge (Deeside District Branch).

Today as a Society we have embraced the more modern needs of our current members and focus on the Social functions. Care and Welfare and a variety of benefits to name but a few. We currently have 3 main meeting areas, Saltney, Llandudno and a new venture in Wrexham, which is going well. We are run by a Committee of Management, which is made up of our members. Members in the Spotlight - Colin Thwaites

I was born in County Durham in May 1945 to a mining family. Mum, dad and my brother all moved to Surrey due to dads health. I left school at 15 and started work with British Rail. I served my apprenticeship in the workshops repairing trains. I worked my way up to be a supervisor. I stayed with the railway for 34 years until they privatised the system. I took very early retirement and redundancy.

Throughout my life my hobby has been St John Ambulance. I have served in uniform for over 60 years retiring in 2023. During my time with St John Ambulance they asked me to join a team to set up an ambulance service at Farnborough Airfield. Then I was asked by Surrey Branch to start an ambulance service, which I did for 13 years. The work was quite demanding and involved taking 999 calls, transfers from hospitals and nursing homes as well as doing repatriation for injured people who were abroad. That meant collecting them from the airports or going to Europe if they were unable to fly.

I joined the Oddfellows in the 70s in South London District in the Pride of Clapham Lodge and was very active there. Unfortunately I started working nights so I could not get to the weekly meetings.



I transferred to Mid-Surrey District as it was closer to home. While I was on a Saga holiday I met my partner and in 2008 moved to Colwyn Bay in North Wales.

When I moved I lost touch with the Oddfellows. Since coming to North Wales I have continued my love for railways and I have become involved in the West Shore Miniature Railway in Llandudno.

I was delighted to discover that there was an Oddfellows group which met each week for coffee and occasional lunches and trips out in Llandudno. I am currently on the Deeside District Committee of Management and hold the Position of Noble Grand at the Lodge meetings. I am still interested in St John Ambulance too.



Financial worries revealed



Unity Mutual, the Oddfellows' financial services brand, recently surveyed 2,000 people throughout the UK to uncover what's keeping them up at night when it comes to their finances. Here's what they discovered. Do any of these resonate with you?

Cost of living

The worry peaks for those aged 40-49, with 63% feeling the pinch, closely followed by those in their 50s and 60s (both at 62%).

Emergency planning

35% of those surveyed worry they don't have enough money set aside for emergencies like car repairs or medical treatments. Additionally, 28% fret about potential home repair costs.

Pension and retirement

Living on a tight pension is a reality for 22% of respondents, and 18% worry they aren't contributing enough to their pension pot. Many in their 60s regret not paying more into their pensions earlier.



Savings and financial planning

Only 39% of people have money in savings or investments, but this number jumps to 61% for those in their 70s. Yet, just a third have a financial life plan.

Stress and anxiety

Financial stress affects 58% of respondents. Those in their 60s and 70s are less worried compared to younger age groups, with only 35% and 27% respectively reporting anxiety.

Financial regrets

Over half (51%) have financial regrets, including not saving enough each month (46%) and spending on pointless things (43%). Interestingly, more than one in 10 (12%) wish they'd married someone with more money.

These findings show that, while financial worries are largely universal, planning and saving can make a significant difference, especially as we age. Whether you're setting up your first financial plan or adjusting your retirement strategy, it's never too late to take control of your financial future.
