'Anchors Aweigh!' Plymouth Oddfellows Support Disabled Sailing Charity

The Plymouth Oddfellows are proud to lend their support to a remarkable local charity, the Plymouth and Devon Schools Sailing Association (PDSSA) which opens up the joy of sailing to people with disabilities.

The Association operates two specially adapted Drascombe Longboats, each designed to give those with a wide range of disabilities the chance to experience sailing around the beautiful Plymouth Sound.

While the Oddfellows contribute nationally to major causes like the RNLI and cancer research, they also champion smaller local charities. The inspiring work of the PDSSA recently came to their attention, prompting a meaningful donation.

Thanks to this support, the PDSSA received a new anchor, a length of heavy-duty rope and a rope bag, all presented to Mike Duffield MBE, President of the Association and Richard Curtis, skipper of one of the boats.

Mike shared that over the summer season the Association enables around 45 people with disabilities to get out on the water. "We welcome participants with a range of challenges from hearing and sight impairments to amputations and stroke recovery and help them discover the freedom of sailing," he said.

Richard also highlighted the crucial role of their third vessel, a RIB rescue boat, and praised the dedication of their 20 volunteers, all highly qualified to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience.

For the 20th time in more than 200 years the Society's Annual Movable Conference (AMC) was held in beautiful Scarborough, hosted by Vale of York Oddfellows.

Members representing their Branches converged on the seaside town from

all corners of the country to assess the previous 12 months and to decide on the direction of the next.

There was change at the top, as South London Oddfellows' John Mann replaced Vale of York Oddfellows' Barbara Needham as Grand Master.

As well as business, attendees enjoyed a range of social activities, including indulging in the delights of an Oddfellows Brass performance, the annual Roy Harmer Memorial Bowls Tournament, and a day trip to Whitby and Scarborough Fair.

Final update from HA Andrews Memorial Fund recipients

Nur Zainal, who's PhD at the University of Southampton has been supported by the HA Andrews Memorial Fund, and Professor of Cancer Biology Tim Fenton (pictured), addressed the Society's annual conference as three years of funding comes to an end.

"My PhD – made possible by the generous support of the Oddfellows – has made some significant contributions to cancer research," said Nur. "My ultimate goal is to find ways to prevent or overcome drug resistance, and my model will let us run

the pre-clinical studies needed to move promising strategies toward the clinic."

Tim added: "Until recently, we did not understand enough about how our immune system recognises and responds to tumours, or about how tumours learn to switch off our immune responses



to deploy cancer vaccines effectively. This is changing rapidly, and cancer vaccines hold great promise for kinder, more effective therapy, though significant challenges remain."
