## A Message from Our Branch Chairman

Hello everyone and welcome to the latest edition of our Out & About. My name is Paul Turner and I have been appointed as the Branch Chairman for the coming year. This is a position that I held back in 2008. I was delighted to be asked to take another turn, although it would be nice to have some 'new blood' coming through to the Committee of Management. The Committee is made up of at least 10 members and helps oversee the running of our Branch. They meet approximately 5 - 6 times a year. We have an Annual Meeting, similar to an AGM, and a half yearly Meeting each year. If you are interested in finding out more about what it involves please contact Denise, the Branch Secretary.

At the Annual Meeting held in February the Committee of Management put forward a proposal to change the name of our Branch - you may have already spotted this on the front cover. The reason behind this is that historically, Deeside District was one of many Districts that covered North East Wales, the Wirral Peninsula, Chester and parts of Cheshire. At its inception, it would have closely mirrored the Deeside postal area.

Over time, many of the neighbouring Districts merged and eventually became part of the existing Deeside District. By the 1980s, Deeside District covered all the aforementioned areas. Moving on into the 1990s and beyond, falling membership numbers across the society meant that further mergers were inevitable. Consequently, in the early 1990s, Gwynedd



District (which covered North West Wales including Anglesey and the Llyn Peninsula) merged with Deeside District covering an unwieldy geographical area of approximately 5,500 square miles, and yet, the name Deeside has always remained.

Moving forward to recent times, mainly for operational reasons, parts of the Wirral have now transferred to Mersey Branch.

The Branch currently holds meetings / social events in three separate locations; Saltney (a suburb of Chester), Wrexham and Craig y Don (outskirts of Llandudno). Also, plans are underway to hold meetings / social events on Anglesey. Interestingly, none of our events are held within the geographical / postal Deeside area. Our membership is increasing in the Wrexham and Llandudno areas, those members find it hard to identify with the name Deeside,

consequently, it was agreed by the members present at the annual meeting to change our name to one that better reflects our identity and geographical area. Our new name is North Wales & Chester Branch. The other recent major change has been the relocation of our Office. The reason behind this that our current lease was due for renewal and with a combination of a few issues we have had, the Committee felt that we could make some significant savings by moving to a more modern, slightly smaller space. The contact details for the new office are above.

Here's a little bit more about myself: My main career has been in the horticultural industry. I have worked at the Wirral Council nursery, a municipal golf course and in the Parks and Gardens Department. When I left the Council I worked with autistic adults teaching them gardening skills and then I was manager at their own garden centre. Following that I briefly worked for a care company and a commercial garden centre.

My hobbies include gardening, supporting my family within the various different aspects motorsport, which include grass tracking, circuit racing, sprint trials and general track days.

I have been a member of the Oddfellows since 1986, I enjoy attending dinner dances, lunches and other events at our Branch and Branches around the country. I have been a scrutineer at the Annual Conference for several years and support my wife Denise (our Branch Secretary) with all that she is involved in through the Society. My son and daughter in-law and their dog Max emigrated to Australia last September so we are looking forward to our visits there in the future.

I hope that you enjoy browsing through this booklet, reading the articles and I hope that you can join us for one of our events. Look forward to seeing you soon.

## Members in the Spotlight - David Boreham

March 14th 2022, the very worst day of my life. It was the day my wife, Pat, died, suddenly and unexpectedly. We had been married for almost sixty-three years, we first met in 1953, and were teenage sweethearts, so for almost seventy years we had shared our lives together. For several weeks, I was lost, did not know what to do, in fact, did very little, until one day I pulled myself together.

I faced the reality that things were never going to be the same and that I should build a new life for myself. I am blessed with a lovely family and fortunate to have them living close to me, they were such a help and support. I also have many good friends, most former colleagues for my working days, I am also a member of the Brymbo Male Voice Choir. I have a strong faith too and have been a member of the Catholic Church all my life, so I also had friends there. Others too who I knew rallied round to help me. However, none of them were what you might call close friends or buddies none of them could ever replace my darling Pat.

I decided that I should fill my days with activities, leave myself no time to sit around and mope. There was a holiday booked, Pat and I were to have a one-week holiday on a narrow boat on the Llangollen canal, this was to be her birthday treat and should have been cancelled. Instead, I managed to persuade some friends to join me, we had a great time, this set me thinking about future holidays. My first



big venture was to India, this three-week tour gave me the ambition to do more travelling. So far, I have completed six trips and have four more booked and have met some lovely people on my journeys.

Shortly before Pat died, we had moved home, downsizing from a large country house to a much smaller bungalow. We had just seven weeks together there but during that time we had discussed and decided to buy a Jaguar sports car.



So, I did, and have had lots of interesting outings, car shows and club events and this has brought me a whole new group of friends. Bitten by the bug, I have since bought three more classic cars, which have given me a great deal of pleasure even more opportunities to meet people. There are other activities too that take up my time but no space to mention here, they all have contributed to my aim of keeping busy, leaving little time to dwell and mope about my loss. I do still speak to Pat every day and miss her so much.

This brings me at last to the point of this article, Oddfellows. I have developed a need to be with people over the last three years, but have one affliction, I am very deaf, and I find conversation difficult when I am in a group situation. It is so much easier to switch off and retire into my own little world, so I have to push myself.

I saw a note on the "Nextdoor" website at the end of last summer that mentioned a new group that was being formed in Wrexham, so I went along to The Lemon Tree, where I met some lovely and interesting people. Not only that, but they were also kind enough to put up with my deafness and went out of their way to help me keep up with the conversation. Since then, we have met up on several occasions and I try to get along to The Lemon Tree on the first and third Wednesday of each month and will continue to do so. "Oddfellows"! Certainly not, they are all lovely people. Anyone who finds themselves in a situation even remotely similar to my own would do well to seek out their nearest Oddfellows group and give it a try.

#### April to May: The tax refund scam

If an offer seems too good to be true, verify it with official sources before taking action.

Stay informed, be sceptical of unsolicited requests for money or personal information, and always verify who you're dealing with before taking action.


