

Cheese Mustard Onion and Herb Loaf Cake

Ingredients

3 large eggs

8oz self raising flour

4oz butter/margarine

90ml sunflower or olive oil

1 teaspoon English mustard

1 teaspoon baking powder

1 teaspoon dried thyme

1 teaspoon dried mixed herbs

1 teaspoon cayenne pepper to taste

1 teaspoon dried chilli flakes to taste

1 medium chopped red onion

5oz grated cheddar cheese

2 tablespoon sour cream or sour cream and chive dip

Method

Pre heat oven to 170 (fan) grease and line a loaf tin, sauté the onion in little oil or butter until well cooked. Cool the onion then coat in some self-raising flour.

Whisk the eggs, mustard, butter, sour cream and oil together in a mixing bowl. Then add in the dry ingredients, grated cheese and onion and



beat into a thickish cake batter. Add a dash of milk if it is too thick. Pour the batter mix into the loaf tin and bake for around 30 - 40 minutes or until skewer comes out clean. Cool and serve.

Lockdown Cheese Biscuits

Ingredients

6oz of plain flour.

3oz of any grated cheese or you could use crumbled blue cheese.

Glug of olive oil.

1 Egg (no need to beat it).

1 teaspoon or mixed herbs or dried rosemary/thyme.

1 teaspoon of chilli flakes (optional)

Glug of milk.

Method

Pre-head oven to 170 (fan). Put all of the above ingredients



into a bowl and mix together. Add a little milk until if forms a stiff dough that you can knead. Roughly knead for 30 seconds then roll out on a floured board to just under 1cm thick. Cut into rounds, use a medium size cutter. Put baking paper on a baking tray and cook for 25 minutes until golden. Let biscuits cool and then enjoy.
