### Story of a Member

Introducing one of our Members, Gwen Parham. She recently celebrated her 100th Birthday and is pictured here with her Oddfellow's Telegram and a card from King Charles III.



On 30 April 1925 Gwen was born at home in Larkwhistle, Hampshire, where she grew up with her two brothers until the family moved to Winchfield. Three days after leaving school aged 14 she went to work in the big house, helping the cook.

Gwen joined the Wrens when she was 17 and a half years old. She started as a ProWren in Mill Hill London, training in cooking. At 18 she was a leading WREN in charge of other girls and went to Rosyth in Scotland. At 20 she was a Petty Officer in charge of two girls cooking for 35 officers at Rosyth in Scotland which was a Royal Naval Base. After she was demobbed, Gwen worked at a hospice in Winchfield before she married Peter on August 19th 1950.

After she married, she had a number of local part-time jobs and worked as a volunteer in charity shops at the age of 70 plus, she was an active member of Help the Aged where she helped cook meals and pushed others in wheelchairs on days out. Pete became a nurse at Broadmoor Hospital and later decided to buy the two shops which served the patients. Gwen ran the shop for him on the female wing for about 10 years.

Gwen and Pete lived in Little Sandhurst before moving to Crowthorne in 1966. Pete passed away in 1999 and in 2011 Gwen decided to move into a nearby bungalow. She managed to live on her own until a few months after her 99th



birthday. She then decided to move into St Brendan's care home on the edge of the village, until she sadly passed away very recently on 5 August.

Gwen will be very much missed by her family, her children, Wendy and Ian, her four grandchildren and four great grandchildren. We are very sorry Gwen did not get to see this article.

### Final update from HA Andrews Memorial Fund recipients

Nur Zainal, whose PhD at the University of Southampton has been supported by the HA Andrews Memorial Fund, and Professor of Cancer Biology Tim Fenton (pictured), addressed the Society's annual conference as three years of funding comes to an end.

"My PhD – made possible by the generous support of the Oddfellows – has made some significant contributions to cancer research," said Nur. "My ultimate goal is to find ways to prevent or overcome drug resistance, and my model will let us run

the pre-clinical studies needed to move promising strategies toward the clinic."

Tim added: "Until recently, we did not understand enough about how our immune system recognises and responds to tumours, or about how tumours learn to switch off our immune responses



to deploy cancer vaccines effectively. This is changing rapidly, and cancer vaccines hold great promise for kinder, more effective therapy, though significant challenges remain."
