As part of her paid work social coordinator Emma Marshall offers welfare support to members. She has undertaken training and has been DBS checked. Welfare officers offer a mixture of telephone advice and support and face to face visits where required. This can be as simple as a call to check a member is ok and to see if any support is required, sending flowers/cards when required, or more complex like hospital or home visits and offering help applying for convalescence etc and signposting to care and welfare where additional support is needed.

Is this something you could help with? We are very keen to recruit more telephone befrienders and welfare officers because we have a lot of members who are needing support. - 3 tbsp/45ml tahini (a sesame seed paste, or peanut butter as an alternate.)
- 1 tbsp olive oil to garnish (optional)

Mixed crudités and toasted pitta bread, to serve (optional)

Method

Step 1

Thoroughly rinse the chickpeas in a colander under cold running water. Tip into the large bowl of a food processor along with 60ml of oil and blitz until almost smooth.

Step 2

Add the garlic, lemon and tahini, and blitz again. If the consistency is too thick, gradually pour in up to 30ml more water. Blitz again for about five minutes, or until the hummus is smooth and silky.

Step 3

Season with a good pinch of sea salt and transfer to a bowl. Swirl the top of the hummus with the back of a dessert spoon and drizzle over a little olive oil. Serve with crunchy crudités and toasted pitta bread, if you like.

Nur Zainal, who's PhD at the University of Southampton has been supported by the HA Andrews Memorial Fund, and Professor of Cancer Biology Tim Fenton (pictured), addressed the Society's annual conference as three years of funding comes to an end.

"My PhD – made possible by the generous support of the Oddfellows – has made some significant contributions to cancer research," said Nur. "My ultimate goal is to find ways to prevent or overcome drug resistance, and my model will let us run

the pre-clinical studies needed to move promising strategies toward the clinic."

Tim added: "Until recently, we did not understand enough about how our immune system recognises and responds to tumours, or about how tumours learn to switch off our immune responses



to deploy cancer vaccines effectively. This is changing rapidly, and cancer vaccines hold great promise for kinder, more effective therapy, though significant challenges remain."
