
Holiday Haiku

The Acorn Branch is hoping to be able to appoint a new Financial Secretary in the new year. At the moment Margaret White is helping in this capacity and will be available to assist with training the new secretary.

The Branch Secretary will be responsible to the Committee of Management for the secretarial and financial administration of the Branch and for looking after the members.

The person appointed will be using the Society's designated computer programme and training for this would probably take place over a few days at our head office in Manchester.

The job involves, for example

- Processing receipts and payments
- Preparing annual financial statements for the Committee of Management prior to submission to an external appointed accountant
- Completing all year-end documentation for submission to Unity Office
- Preparing and updating financial reports and budgets on a monthly basis following completion of the monthly bank reconciliation
- Preparing other returns or documents required by the District, Unity or any other statutory body

In addition it would be necessary for the Secretary to attend monthly Business Meetings which are held in Ferndown, Committee of Management meetings (every six weeks or so) and Trustees' meetings as required. This would involve the preparation of agendas, recording of minutes and the implementation of decisions made.

Other responsibilities include dealing with membership applications and correspondence, collection of contributions, maintenance of membership records, processing Branch and Unity benefits, and actively seeking to increase the membership of the Branch. Liaison with the Branch Welfare Officer and Social Secretary to support the members will also be an essential requirement.

Liaison with Unity Office and the District will also be required as necessary.

At present this is an annualised post of 10 hours per week for $\pounds 12$ per hour, working from home.

In addition the Branch is also looking to appoint a new Social Secretary as Flo Munro is retiring at the end of 2021 after many years of service.

This role involves the co-ordination, organisation, administration and development of social events for the Branch.

Key tasks would involve

- Organising and over-seeing social events at least one per month. All the venues for the 2022 social events have already been booked at the Three Cross Village Hall in Three Legged Cross.
- Undertaking all administration involved in the social events, including collecting money, dealing with bookings, confirming venues and maintaining a log of attendees
- Promoting events internally and externally
- Completing risk assessments as necessary


At present this is a voluntary role, but remuneration will be by agreement with the Trustees and the Committee of Management.

It may be possible to combine both the Branch Secretary and Social Secretary roles.

We hope that you are all aware of the amazing support that is available to our members. We thought we would just outline a few of the wonderful ways that our members have been helped in recent times.

Support from Home Instead has been organised for several members. An elderly lady suddenly lost her long time carer at very short notice – the lodge stepped in and with the help of head office organised Home Instead to help until permanent care could be sorted out. Members have also received help after leaving hospital for various reasons eg following a heart attack, a shoulder operation, a fall etc. There is a qualifying period of membership before you become eligible for Convalescence Benefit support.

Benevolence Grants have been given to help with transport to hospital appointments, for essential equipment, etc etc. Benevolence grants are available from day one of membership.

Please remember that we are here to help - it we don't know, then we can't help. If you think that we can help you, then please contact either your Lodge Secretary or the District Secretary for advice.




