Izaak Walton's Cottage

Izaak Walton, who was born in Staffordshire on 9 August 1593, was the celebrated author of the 'Compleat Analer', one of the mostread and best-known books in the English language, owned this charming cottage (on the front cover) that nestles in the tiny hamlet of Shallowford, between Stafford and Eccleshall. His charming thatched 16th century half-timbered cottage will be of interest to anglers and non-anglers alike. It offers a marvellous insight into the history of fishing and the literary talent of Stafford's famous son.

Izaak left the cottage in his will to the people of his home town of Stafford,

and now the museum pays homage to his illustrious life. Inside we learn about Izaak Walton the Merchant, Churchman, biographer, writer, angler and Royalist. We learn of his great contribution to the genre of biography and his influence as an early conservationist.

Within the cottage the period rooms are furnished to reflect the rural trappings of the 17th Century. There are also rooms dedicated to Izaak the writer and biographer and to the history and evolution of angling.

The ground floor shop has a range of gifts, souvenirs and local arts and crafts. Nestled within the beautiful Staffordshire countryside, its tranquil environment is perfect for a calm and relaxing afternoon.

Found on the Oddfellows website under History Odd Fact - Oddfellows pubs

Public houses were often used as the base for regular Society business. When members met, they often 'took something for the good of the house'. To secure such lucrative trade, landlords were willing to name their pubs after us. Oddfellows Arms remains a popular pub name to this day (www.oddfellows.co.uk).





Last year, criminal gangs stole £470 million by pretending to be from banks or other service providers. A new pilot scheme launched by Stop Scams UK, a group of organisations including telecoms companies and banks, aims to collect evidence to show that calling 159 helps to fight fraud.

159 is a secure number that connects you directly to your bank. It works in the same way as 101 for the police or 111 for the NHS. The advice is to call 159 when you are contacted about a financial matter, whether or not it seems suspicious, eg the caller says they are from your bank, or asks you to transfer money.

Over 70% of UK current account holders are covered by the pilot participating banks include, Barclays, Lloyds, NatWest and Santander. Other banks may join over the course of the pilot.

Almost all UK mobile and landlines are able to use 159. Participating phone companies are BT (including EE and PlusNet), O2 (including giffgaff), TalkTalk, Three, Virgin Media, Sky and Vodaphone. Calling 159 costs the same as a national rate call and is usually part of the included minutes in most phone tariffs. If calling 159 doesn't work for any reason, contact your bank in the normal way, using the number on your bank card. 159 will never call you. Only a fraudster will object to you calling 159.


The donation marks the final instalment of a major three-year funding partnership, which totalled £85,000.


