Trip of a Lifetime

To personally celebrate our two 'nought' birthdays and my retirement from the Board Steve and I decided to have a holiday of a lifetime especially as we now had the time to be away! We cruised the bottom of Australia, Bay of Islands, North Island of New Zealand and the Sounds followed by Fiji, Samoa and Tonga. It was a great experience and we met some super people.

I thought you might be interested in the Oddfellows buildings that we photographed rather than the cricket grounds we toured!

The Melbourne building is the most interesting having been built on the corner of Collins Street & Swanston Street at the time of the Great Depression and providing employment for many. The land was purchased for £335,000 in 1928 but the lease for the business in the existing building didn't expire until the end of 1931. So on the 1 January 1932





demolition of the buildings on the site took place and construction of the Art Deco building began.

As you can probably see from the photo there are twelve floors and a tower to the building which when completed was the tallest in Melbourne; it was also the first with escalators and had three highspeed lifts. On the ground floor there is a shopping arcade with mosaic floor and tiled and painted walls with symbols and pictures well known to us from our banners and regalia. The names of the Board members and Grandmaster of the time are prominent on the walls and as you can see above the lifts. The building was opened on 12 December 1932.



During World War II the building was used by the Australian Army and it was compulsorily acquired by the Commonwealth in 1947. In September 1979, having decided against an expensive refurbishment, the MUIOOF sold the building for \$5.25 million but retained a main lease for its offices. Since our return home I have found that you can have tours of the Boardroom and the building which would have been interesting and are linked to meals in the restaurant. So if you're going to Melbourne look online to book a tour!

Don't forget the first Lodge in Australia was Strangers Refuge in 1840

The less imposing Odd Fellows building is at Dunedin (Otago District) New Zealand no longer in use and I haven't had any joy finding out any history so far. Like so many of the Odd Fellows Halls in this country, those overseas now have other uses as theatres or shops or offices.

News from the Bedford and Victoria Branches Visit to Kimbolton Castle

On Wednesday 24 July (almost the hottest day in the year!) 19 members from the Victoria and Bedford Branches enjoyed a private guided tour of the Castle followed by tea and cake in the village church.

Divided into two groups we moved between trees for shade in the grounds whilst learning about the various adaptations of the building and identifying them from the exterior although very little of the mediaeval castle can be identified.

The first castle or fortified, moated manor house on the site dated back to 1200. Much of the Tudor and Jacobean manor house which followed remains on the ground floor but it is principally a late Stuart house, undergoing a Great Rebuilding by the 4th Earl of Manchester between 1690-1720. The ceilings, paintings, murals, chapel and staircase were a revelation to those of us who only knew the castle from its stone exterior, the Adam Gatehouse, and its reputation as a public school.

Most people will have heard of the Castle as the last residence of Queen Katherine of Aragon who lived there from May 1534 until her death on 7th January 1536. Her embalmed body lay in the Chapel for nearly three weeks before it was carried to the Abbey Church at Peterborough for



burial. During the Second World War the Castle was occupied by the Royal Army Medical Corps and in 1950 it was bought by Kimbolton School. The upper rooms are teaching rooms, the State Rooms are used by the Sixth Form and Staff, and the lower rooms are common rooms, offices and store rooms. New Science blocks and Bursar's office etc are built in the grounds screened by trees.

We chose to go partly because there used to be a Lodge in Kimbolton (Duke of Manchester established 1842) which was part of the Wellingborough District (now Victoria Lodge) with an Odd Fellows Hall in East Street. We hope to do a guided walk in Kimbolton next spring.

The Castle is open twice a year on the first Sunday in March and November or at other times by prior arrangement. It's well worth a visit!

News from the Albert Branch A Day Out to Ely



The small city of Ely in Cambridgeshire is renowned for its magnificent Cathedral, affectionately referred to as "The Ship of the Fens' and the very famous character from English history, Oliver Cromwell. Our trip this day was to visit the Cathedral.

No journey would be complete without tea and cake at a good garden centre on the way and we were recommended to stop at the Twenty Pence Garden Centre at Wilburton and it did not disappoint.

With tea drunk and cake eaten we entered Ely past Oliver Cromwell's house but visiting that place will be for another day. The Cathedral is on an immense scale and the decoration is breath-taking. How we wished we were able to travel back in time to when the building was newly completed, it must have looked amazing.

All in all it was very nice day out.

So I would like to thank all the Oddfellows for giving us this break which gave us both the strength to cope with the difficult times which have followed the death of Roz.
