### Reading District Member Iris Yates 28 September 1918 - Sunday 27 January 2019

Iris was born on 28 September 1918 near Leafield in Oxfordshire. She was the oldest of seven children the family moving to Wokingham in Berkshire where her mum and dad owned a sweet and tobacco shop. Her father had been serving in the Royal Berkshire Regiment during World War I but returned to his original work as a carpenter and joiner. The family had a house with a lovely aarden of which her father was very proud. Iris had two years off school when she was ten years old with an illness similar to rheumatic fever which meant she missed out on exams. the illness was to affect her much later in life. When Iris was 14. she went out to work taking on several different jobs such as housework and shop work where she was to eventually meet her future husband Charlie.

Iris knew Charlie for a year when working in John Quality Ltd., before walking out with him as the saying goes (what a lovely phrase). Their love blossomed and they were married on Boxing Day 1939. Charlie was in the Royal Horse Artillery Territorial when he was called up for the Second World War. His first posting abroad was in Iceland from where he had leave at Christmas 1941. Their son Alan was born in September 1942 and Marilyn came along in March 1947. They both enjoyed a lovely childhood and later married Sylvia and Peter respectively. Iris was to suffer much sadness when her dear Charlie died after 62 years of very happy marriage together. Further sadness came when Alan's wife Sylvia passed away and Alan himself in 2017.



In August 1993, Iris and Charlie came along to the Oddfellows and were quickly initiated into the Princess Alexandra Branch. they proved wonderful acquisitions for the Branch with neither looking back from the day they joined. Although Iris never wanted to become an officer in the Branch (Charlie was Noble Grand in 1986) she was always fully partook in Branch matters. As a team, both Charlie and Iris were prominent members of the Three Links Association and were instrumental in many of the activities and outings that were enjoyed by the club. Sadly, this fine gathering of older members was forced to disband with the last meeting on Thursday 31 May 2007 much to their dismay.

Iris was a great supporter of Reading Football Club following in her parent's footsteps and also a keen member of the Reading District Indoor Sports who met on Friday evenings during winter months. She won many trophies and was especially good at shove ha'penny, dominoes and cribbage so if you were able to beat Iris in any of those competitions you either had a stroke of luck or you played a blinder such was Iris's prowess.

As time moved on, I believe Iris really did want to reach her centenary and on Friday 28 September 2018 that desire came true and a number of Oddfellows, friends and family members celebrated her 100th. birthday in Parkside Care Home. The guest of honour was Sir John Madejski, the former owner of Reading F.C. whom Iris had met whilst celebrating her 90th birthday with a tour of Reading F.C.s ground. The occasion was highlighted in the local paper and anyone looking at the pictures that appeared would have said that Iris did not appear old enough to be celebrating that BIG birthday! Sadly, the party seemed to take its toll on Iris and she seemed to be unable to bounce back from niggling issues as she had done many times before. Iris sadly passed away in the early hours of Sunday 27 January 2019 and in Iris, we have lost a lovely, warm-hearted lady and a great Oddfellow. May she rest in peace re-united with her dearest Charlie. May God bless you both.

# Five tips to help you cut down on the booze

Many of us enjoy a glass of wine with our meal or a beer in front of the television, but this casual drinking can add up. You may find that, without realising, you are consuming more alcohol than is good for you.

But how much booze is too much?

The current guidance is that men and women should not drink more than 14 units of alcohol per week, which is equal to six 175ml glasses of wine or six pints of beer. So, if you're currently drinking more than the recommended amount, how can you change your drinking habits? Here are five tips that can help:

#### 1. Go low

There is a huge range of low alcohol wines, beers and gins available nowadays. You may even find that you prefer the taste of some brands. If you drink the same amount but switch to low, or even alcohol-free, drinks then you will be automatically cutting down the units you're consuming.

#### 2. Dine out on it

Another way to reduce your alcohol intake would be to only drink it with a meal. So have your glass of merlot at dinner or a G&T with lunch, but switch to soft drinks or have a brew when you're finished.

#### 3. Take it day by day

If you find yourself drinking every day of the week, then your body is not really getting any break from alcohol. Plan in a couple of alcohol-free days which work best for you. Sometimes it's just a matter of breaking the habit.



#### 4. Size matters

One way to reduce your alcohol intake is to go for smaller measures. Enjoy a small glass of wine instead of a large one, and take your time with it. If you prefer beer, opt for a half-pint. Spritzers or shandies are good alternatives, giving you a large drink but with reduced alcohol content.

#### 5. Get Appy

# Spotting the difference between collecting and hoarding

Many will have heard of hoarding, but are unsure of what it really means. There are TV shows, news articles and videos floating around on social media which aim to educate people about the problem, but more commonly, they just fuel misconceptions.

An estimated five per cent of the population has issues with hoarding, but only a small number of them seek assistance, despite services being available.

Hoarding disorder is a fairly new term, and it is classified as a distinct mental health condition, although often it can occur alongside other mental health issues. On the surface, it may just appear that somebody needs help clearing out or tidying up, but this sort of action can be hugely detrimental if the underlying issues are not addressed first.

### So what's the difference between collecting and hoarding?

Collectors have a particular focus, and often buy, save or restore similar types of items such as vinyl records, coins, stamps or toys. Collections are carefully curated and displayed in an ordered way, to be enjoyed and shared with others.

On the other hand, hoarders acquire their items in a less selective way, and often don't properly store, use or even look at these things once retained, as their focus is always on getting more.



Hoarders often feel distressed at the thought of discarding items, regardless of their value, and this can often result in large areas of the home rendered useless due to being filled with clutter, such as the bedroom or kitchen. As the issue progresses, this can lead to health and safety hazards, difficulty leaving the house, deterioration of personal hygiene, low selfesteem and self-imposed isolation.

### On your marks, get set, parkrun

There aren't many things left in life that are free, but one growing phenomenon that is completely gratis is parkrun.

The 5km community events take place in parks each Saturday morning, but parkrun is more than a way of keeping fit, it's a way of making friends, being part of a community, and even inspiration to travel the world.

Parkrun isn't a race. There are no winners, volunteer Tail Walkers ensure that nobody finishes last, and the emphasis is on regular participation rather than performance. There are more than 550 5km courses in the UK and 1,600 across the world, with more than 235,000 adults and juniors taking part on a good weekend globally. Additionally, there are 250 junior parkruns on Sunday mornings for 4-14 year-olds and their families that are 2k in distance.

You don't need to be a top athlete. At any event you will find parents with pushchairs, dog walkers and people who have never taken part in organised physical activity before. If you use a wheelchair, then you're also welcome, but it's probably worth checking the individual course you fancy doing is accessible with the organisers before setting off.

The events have a great reputation for being friendly and often there's a catch-up after the event at a local café over tea.

It's easy to get started. Register on the website *www.parkrun.org.uk* and you will be given an individual barcode. Print it out and turn up at the event you fancy taking part in. The events all start at 9am in the UK, except for in Scotland and Northern Ireland where they kick off at 9.30am.

If you don't fancy walking or running, then volunteering at the events is a brilliant way to meet people and give back to the community. Each event is self-organising and has its own team of volunteers who would be very pleased to have an extra pair of hands.
