The Dance to Health programme is a national initiative, using dance-based exercise to prevent falls and help people stay independent for longer. Backed by evidence-based research, the sessions combine fun routines with gentle

Mohammed has been visiting many of our Cuppa & Chat groups, offering friendly, informal drop-in sessions to help members build confidence with technology - from setting up emails and adding apps to phones, to spotting online scams and staying safe on the internet.

His approachable one-to-one support has been a huge hit, with plenty of “aha!” moments as members tackled the digital world with renewed confidence. At recent sessions in Dudley and Solihull, members also took part in a fun ‘Are You Scam



Savvy?’ quiz, testing their knowledge on how to stay one step ahead of fraudsters.

These visits have been part of AbilityNet’s free digital skills training for over 65s, delivered in partnership with BT Group, and have made a real difference to members who may have felt unsure about technology before.
