# **Goodbye from Jane Nicole**

When I first started working for Concord Branch, not far short of 25 years ago, Concord had just become a Financial Branch within the auspices of Reading District,



having previously been a Financial Branch within the then Godalming District. Some reading this may remember my predecessor, Anne Breeze, who was my mother. I had been working as PA to the Head of **Pharmacy at Frimley Park Hospital** but wanted to move into accountancy rather than an administrative role. The interviews were arranged – I can remember how odd it felt being interviewed for my mother's job in her home office. Of course Mum was only on the interview panel for the other candidates, and when it was my turn she went to make a round of drinks.

Although I had been a member of The Oddfellows for a few years before becoming Branch Secretary, I knew nothing about the workings of the Branch, so it was a steep learning curve for me. The computerised accounting package, such as it was, was based on the old MS-DOS. The Society has of course tried to move with the times to remain relevant to a modern day culture, and so now most things are done electronically. I've always had the pleasure of a very supportive Committee who have come to my aid in various ways during challenging times, and for that I am enormously grateful. 2023 was one of those challenging times, losing first my father in June, and then a few months later, my mother. So I planned for a retirement date of 1 October 2023. That was the plan, and we informed all our members once we had appointed a new District Secretary and overseen her training. Sadly it wasn't meant to be, so I picked up the reins again. Sorry for the disappointment that might have caused a few members - I had to inflict myself on you for a further few months to help keep the show on the road!

Now, a year later, I am so thrilled with the wonderful new staff team we have in place. Laura came first taking on the role of Concord Social Organiser. Laura's enthusiasm right from the start has been so very encouraging to me; she really has taken to the job like a duck to water. I know that with Laura heading up our social offering we are in safe hands. Thank you Laura!

Then Steph arrived to take on the definitely more onerous role of Concord District Secretary. It's been my prayer for a while that we would have two new staff members who would work together as a good team, and that has definitely been the experience to date. I am delighted that we have Steph on board – there is a LOT to learn about the work of a District Secretary, with each District having its' own nuances, so Steph will have to 'summer and winter' her role until she has experienced everything at least once! A BIG thank you to Steph for taking over the reins – I've loved my working life with Oddfellows, but I'm happy to be moving onto a new phase in my life. This is me now bowing out. I love all that The Oddfellows stands for, and so I am delighted to still be able to serve Concord in my capacity as a Trustee and member of the Management Committee, and of course I'll look forward to seeing many of you at future social events.

# A the autism

The Autism Trust is a training centre for young people with autism, 16 years and above aiming to create meaningful futures for young adults with autism. We provide a supportive and nurturing environment fostering independence, building life skills, and generating community support and awareness of the capabilities of individuals with autism. Through ASDAN training, and functional work experience we equip young adults to work and enjoy the communities they live in.

Work experience is gained managing 'Polly's Place' gift shop and art gallery selling handcrafted items and art made by people with autism, their families, and supporters. In this environment young adults with autism learn retail, office, manufacturing, photography, social media, hospitality, housekeeping, gardening and independent living skills. The bespoke training is tailored to an individual's needs, delivering specialist support and encouragement to gain skills and grow in confidence. The Autism Trust also supports the autism community by offering parent to parent support, as well as Coffee and Support Mornings and Lego and Craft clubs during school holidays, for families who find it difficult to access clubs with autism understanding.

As a non-profit charity we provide Bespoke ASD training for adults with autism and our current training centre provides all the employment opportunities needed for those courses. However, having expanded our curriculum to include Life Skills and Independent courses, we have found a need for a living space that an adult might move into i.e. a flat. The charity is unable to fund such a flat, especially one that would not actually be lived in. The plan is to use the old Managers Office at the Railway Station to fulfil this deficit in our current training centre facilities.

To get maximum use of the space, it will be used for several purposes for the charity.

Firstly, as a mock flat, for use for independence training during the day for our trainees on the ASDAN Courses which are bespoke for the adults with autism. The train station will also benefit the trainees from a link to the railway for the travel training course and could aid towards the employment training that we already provide but could enable this to be expanded to include travel aspects of employment.

The space will also be used to host an evening social and friendship group for adults with autism, who do not like public houses and environments that cause them sensory issues. The social club will not only provide a space for interaction, game play and a chance to meet safely but also social interaction training and mindful opportunities.

Additionally, there is the opportunity to hold sessions for small groups of parents or families to provide behavioural training or support strategies to those who are new to the autistic community and are struggling to find a way forward.

The Autism Trust is transforming the vending kiosk to sell handmade products from Polly's Place. This will provide an opportunity for the services users and autistic volunteers to gain experience of a real working environment and to be able to interact with the general public. We also hope to obtain a grant for a coffee machine and provide Barista training to the service users, so they can sell hot drinks as well. This will also provide an opportunity for the public to support people with autism, see and purchase products made by them and appreciate what they can do and not what they can't. It is an opportunity for the communities to come together and support diversity and inclusion.

Our current project is to get the above spaces ready and usable for the purposes outlined. The support of Oddfellows will help us towards meeting this goal and supporting the Autism Community in so many ways.

This project will benefit the entire autism community in different ways, whilst supporting, developing and enhancing the role of the Railway station in the local community.

### **Financial worries revealed**



Unity Mutual, the Oddfellows' financial services brand, recently surveyed 2,000 people throughout the UK to uncover what's keeping them up at night when it comes to their finances. Here's what they discovered. Do any of these resonate with you?

#### **Cost of living**

The worry peaks for those aged 40-49, with 63% feeling the pinch, closely followed by those in their 50s and 60s (both at 62%).

#### **Emergency planning**

35% of those surveyed worry they don't have enough money set aside for emergencies like car repairs or medical treatments. Additionally, 28% fret about potential home repair costs.

#### **Pension and retirement**

Living on a tight pension is a reality for 22% of respondents, and 18% worry they aren't contributing enough to their pension pot. Many in their 60s regret not paying more into their pensions earlier.



#### Savings and financial planning

Only 39% of people have money in savings or investments, but this number jumps to 61% for those in their 70s. Yet, just a third have a financial life plan.

#### **Stress and anxiety**

Financial stress affects 58% of respondents. Those in their 60s and 70s are less worried compared to younger age groups, with only 35% and 27% respectively reporting anxiety.

#### **Financial regrets**

Over half (51%) have financial regrets, including not saving enough each month (46%) and spending on pointless things (43%). Interestingly, more than one in 10 (12%) wish they'd married someone with more money.

These findings show that, while financial worries are largely universal, planning and saving can make a significant difference, especially as we age. Whether you're setting up your first financial plan or adjusting your retirement strategy, it's never too late to take control of your financial future.
