Warhammer Talks



We had the pleasure of hosting two talks from John (Brian to our members) Thornthwaite, former head of Plastics Management at Games Workshop, producers of the world-famous miniature war games, Warhammer and Warhammer 40,000.

The first event focussed on John's career, and how his skills transferred from companies such as Matchbox, to developing the injection moulding process that brought Games Workshop's Warhammer to the forefront of miniature war gaming. There was an exhibition of miniatures (including a unique variant



of Trish Carden's Talisman Dragon), literature, and other curios from John's personal collection, and some sample armies displayed from a local awardwinning Warhammer collector.

The second event went into more depth about the processes specific to manufacturing Warhammer miniatures, and John's involvement in early discussions with some of Games Workshop's most famous names as Warhammer came into being. A local hobbyist gave a demonstration on 3D printing miniatures for war gaming, including insights on how the process works, entry costs, common problems and pitfalls. There was an exhibition of a diorama table with two armies provided by local hobbyists.

Food Bank Talk

Graham from the Deepings Food Bank gave us a very informative talk. He explained the Food Bank was opened in December 2013 and is run by 20 volunteers on a rota basis. The food is mainly collected from donations made in Tesco (where the box is emptied twice a week), Coop, local churches and schools. On average 16 people in the area are fed every day through this service. Tesco give 20% of the weight of food collected in the shop as money to the Charity for their running costs.

Due to insurance restrictions the volunteers are not able to give financial advice, but are able to signpost people to the appropriate charity or organisation who can help with filling in paperwork etc. to help with claiming further financial support. The Charity is very lucky that it only pays a peppercorn rent of £1 per annum. They are located at the Old Scout Hut in Deeping St. James. Today the centre costs roughly £255,000 a year to run (most of that is vet bills and food). The money mainly comes from Bourne charity shop, legacies in wills, grants, boarding dogs and cats, and through individual on-site pet cremations. Last year they successfully rehomed 120 animals.

Financial worries revealed



Unity Mutual, the Oddfellows' financial services brand, recently surveyed 2,000 people throughout the UK to uncover what's keeping them up at night when it comes to their finances. Here's what they discovered. Do any of these resonate with you?

Cost of living

The worry peaks for those aged 40-49, with 63% feeling the pinch, closely followed by those in their 50s and 60s (both at 62%).

Emergency planning

35% of those surveyed worry they don't have enough money set aside for emergencies like car repairs or medical treatments. Additionally, 28% fret about potential home repair costs.

Pension and retirement

Living on a tight pension is a reality for 22% of respondents, and 18% worry they aren't contributing enough to their pension pot. Many in their 60s regret not paying more into their pensions earlier.



Savings and financial planning

Only 39% of people have money in savings or investments, but this number jumps to 61% for those in their 70s. Yet, just a third have a financial life plan.

Stress and anxiety

Financial stress affects 58% of respondents. Those in their 60s and 70s are less worried compared to younger age groups, with only 35% and 27% respectively reporting anxiety.

Financial regrets

Over half (51%) have financial regrets, including not saving enough each month (46%) and spending on pointless things (43%). Interestingly, more than one in 10 (12%) wish they'd married someone with more money.

These findings show that, while financial worries are largely universal, planning and saving can make a significant difference, especially as we age. Whether you're setting up your first financial plan or adjusting your retirement strategy, it's never too late to take control of your financial future.
