## Alexander Lee Powerlifter



Our member Alexander Lee is a power lifter, who despite being in his ninth decade, continues to break powerlifting records. He has recently set 2 new world records for his age category. On March 2 he competed in the Drug-Free Powerlifting competition, where he lifted 112.5 kilos in the unequipped bench press, beating the existing record by 15 kilos. In the equipped bench press, he lifted 127.5 kilos, surpassing the previous record by 25 kilos.

In addition to his own success, Lee has trained 12 British Champions, seven of which went on to compete internationally. Among them is powerlifter-turned gladiator Karanjeet Kaur Bains, who

he trained while she was at Durham University. Alexander, a former British gymnastics champion, transitioned to weightlifting at 17 and by 19 he became a British Champion. After stepping away from competition in 1974 for training to be a teacher, he returned 20 years ago to focus on bench pressing.

Over these years he has broken 12 world records. Despite health concerns, including complications from a coronary bypass, Alexander remains determined to compete. His achievements have been recognised by the Drug Free Powerlifting, so solidifying his status as a record breaking athlete still at 80 years of age.

What would the health and safety police have to say about that these days? In those days we were superstitious about bringing the pram home until the baby had safely arrived. So when Amira arrived, my first cockney baby delivered at St Bartholemews Hospital, Mohamed accompanied by my mum went to pick

up the pram and filled it with celebratory drinks! My mum, even when she was confused with Dementia would still relate to this story. The pram then went on to carry many babies. Amira, Shireen and Tareq in London and also lent to a friend for her baby.

When we left London I wanted to bring the pram with me. Mohamed couldn't understand my attachment.

I must have been psychic!! Because along came our little surprise Nadia.

When my first grandson was born I found a brown bag and sunshade for the pram on Ebay. I was so pleased.

The pram then journeyed on to carry all 7 grandchildren and is still going strong. Whenever I take the pram out people always comment on how lovely it is and how they remember their prams.






Royal Yacht Britannia - Edinburgh.



For the 20th time in more than 200 years the Society's Annual Movable Conference (AMC) was held in beautiful Scarborough, hosted by Vale of York Oddfellows.

Members representing their Branches converged on the seaside town from

all corners of the country to assess the previous 12 months and to decide on the direction of the next.

There was change at the top, as South London Oddfellows' John Mann replaced Vale of York Oddfellows' Barbara Needham as Grand Master.

As well as business, attendees enjoyed a range of social activities, including indulging in the delights of an Oddfellows Brass performance, the annual Roy Hamer Memorial Bowls Tournament, and a day trip to Whitby and Scarborough Fair.

## Final update from HA Andrews Memorial Fund recipients

Nur Zainal, who's PhD at the University of Southampton has been supported by the HA Andrews Memorial Fund, and Professor of Cancer Biology Tim Fenton (pictured), addressed the Society's annual conference as three years of funding comes to an end.

"My PhD – made possible by the generous support of the Oddfellows – has made some significant contributions to cancer research," said Nur. "My ultimate goal is to find ways to prevent or overcome drug resistance, and my model will let us run

the pre-clinical studies needed to move promising strategies toward the clinic."

Tim added: "Until recently, we did not understand enough about how our immune system recognises and responds to tumours, or about how tumours learn to switch off our immune responses



to deploy cancer vaccines effectively. This is changing rapidly, and cancer vaccines hold great promise for kinder, more effective therapy, though significant challenges remain."
