A Pipe Dream

As a schoolboy living in Dover during the Second World War I witnessed the Battle of Britain and the Heroes of the Day were the pilots who flew the Spitfires and Hurricanes. I was going to be a pilot when I grew up but life does not always pan out as you plan, but 80 plus years later I lived the Spitfire dream.

Rita and I spent a sunny May afternoon watching the planes fly in and out of Headcorn Aerodrome when a Spitfire flew in. Over in the Aero Legends office they said the weather was perfect for a flight and the plane was ready and waiting. I signed the form presented my bank card and the deal was done.

After a half hour safety briefing I was kitted out in flying overalls, helmet, boots and gloves and with the help of the ground crew I was seated in the backseat of a Spitfire.

With a blast of noise and smoke the engine then settled to a steady beat, it was time to taxi down to the end of the runway, the pilot asked if I was ok and ready to go, I said 'Yes', I said 'Yes'. So with full power we were soon off the runway and climbing towards the Kent coast.

We crossed the coast and turn north toward Folkestone and on to the Battle of Britain memorial at Capel; which we flew round before flying along the coast to Dover. We did a roll just outside the breakwater and then onto St Margaret's Bay, here we turned inland around Dover and headed south.

The pilot asked if I would like to have a go at flying it, I id and few wobbly turns and handed control back to the pilot, he then showed me what a Spitfire can do in steep turn, roll, loops, dives, climbs at high speed, soon the Kent countryside is below you and next it is over your head then it is rolling round in front of you but now it is time to head back to Headcorn. The pilot said we would do a low run down the runway into a steep climb and roll off the top and then land. We did a smooth landing and taxi and with the help of the ground crew climbed out of the Spitfire.

Dream completed!


The Weymouth Land Train got well used by our group and I think from listening

Nur Zainal, who's PhD at the University of Southampton has been supported by the HA Andrews Memorial Fund, and Professor of Cancer Biology Tim Fenton (pictured), addressed the Society's annual conference as three years of funding comes to an end.

"My PhD – made possible by the generous support of the Oddfellows – has made some significant contributions to cancer research," said Nur. "My ultimate goal is to find ways to prevent or overcome drug resistance, and my model will let us run

the pre-clinical studies needed to move promising strategies toward the clinic."

Tim added: "Until recently, we did not understand enough about how our immune system recognises and responds to tumours, or about how tumours learn to switch off our immune responses



to deploy cancer vaccines effectively. This is changing rapidly, and cancer vaccines hold great promise for kinder, more effective therapy, though significant challenges remain."
