New recipient of HA Andrews Memorial Fund

The new recipient of our UK medical research fund, the HA Andrews Memorial Fund, was agreed at this year's annual conference.



From 2022 to 2024, we're supporting the Centre for Cancer Immunology based at the University of Southampton. £100,000 in funding has been granted to enable the Centre's study of a specific gene which it is believed can be manipulated to target cancer cells in a new vaccine.

The ultimate goal is to create a vaccine that could fundamentally change outcomes for patients with cancer, particularly lung, breast, head, neck oesophageal and bladder cancers. The research is led by Dr Tim Fenton and Professor Edd James who will also be supervising a full-time PHD student funded by the Oddfellows.



We look forward to hearing how the Centre's research is progressing and sharing some insights with you when the Board makes its first visit later in the year.

Are you an Extra Benefits member?

Don't forget you are entitled to claim towards optical and dental costs as part of your membership.

Dental Care Benefit – available every year from year two of membership

£30 towards check-ups and treatment. Claims must include an original receipt. You cannot claim for payments to a dental payment plan or any cost already covered by a dental insurance policy. Any claims must be made within 12 months of the date of treatment, or the date of the receipt for treatment – whichever is earlier

Optical Care benefit – available every other membership year from year two of membership

£30 towards sight tests, glasses or contact lenses. Claims must include an original receipt. Any claims must be made within 12 months of the date of treatment, or the date of the receipt for treatment – whichever is earlier.

Are you a Life or Associate member?

You are also entitled to claim towards optical and dental costs – don't miss out...

For more information and to make a claim:

Contact Lynne to ask for a claim form. When returning you will need to attach original receipts from the dentist/optician. They must be dated with your name on and include the name of the dentist/ optical provider and the amount paid. Credit and debit card receipts are not accepted. Membership subscriptions must be paid up to date.
