Social Reports from Wynyard Road Community Centre

In September, we had a delightful, quite hilarious evening with Barbara Beveridge, a farmer's wife.

She told us about her training in dairy work at a local agricultural college where she subsequently met her husband, a dairy farmer. Then an insight into her work with the Milk Marketing Board and then her life on various farms until they settled down in West Auckland with three children and a dairy herd and the horrors of foot and mouth disease.

At one time, they had lived on a farm on the Pennine Way, where Barbara catered for bed and breakfast guests to eke out their income.

Barbara now makes and sells preserves and brought along samples for us to taste as well as jars of jam, lemon curd, marmalade and various chutneys for us to buy. At the end of the evening, her sales table was virtually empty. She is coming again next September!

In October, we were entertained by local historian, Frances Wilson, again. This time she told us about Georgian Hartlepool (the Headland) and the poor in the late 1870s, until the railways came in 1841 bringing prosperity and the Irish navvies.

In Georgian times, the Headland was virtually cut off by the sea and resembled Jersey on a smaller scale, populated mainly by just six families, all involved in fishing.

Our first project was a banana, this raised a few laughs and a lot of banter as to the size and shape of some of the specimens on offer. In all though, the standard of work was really impressive. Even the most outlandish efforts were recognizable as some form of fruit!

We then progressed on to lemons, apples, oranges and strawberries.
We were let into some secret tricks (devised by Neville) to add the finishing

touches to our masterpieces. A clove stem was used to trim the orange, a cheese grater gave texture to the orange skin, rolling in sugar finished off the strawberry perfectly and finally a little pea sized piece of green marzipan was squashed and pressed on to the strawberry and trimmed with a toothpick to form the leaves. Terrific!

It was amazing what we managed to produce with some very basic tools: A toothpick, a cheese grater, a bowl of sugar and a glass of Vodka (we had to make do with water today).

After all the blood sweat and tears, we broke for tea and biscuits and inspected everyone else's work, then the raffle
