# Looking after Staffordshire's wildlife for over 50 years

#### Staffordshire Wildlife Trust is your local wildlife charity. Established in 1969 they are dedicated to protecting the county's wildlife and wild places.

The Trust's main offices are at the Wolseley Centre in Wolseley Bridge, near Rugeley, which is also a popular visitor centre. They have another visitor centre in Stoke-on-Trent, the Westport Lake Visitor Centre. They were the first Wildlife Trust to launch a charity shop in their mission to raise funds for Staffordshire's Wildlife.

Their work would not be possible without people's support. The Visitor Centre underwent a revamp in 2019 with many improvements and features being added such as a new look gift shop, the Kingfisher café overlooking Swan Lake and a learning hub dedicated to educational activities.

The Kingfisher Café uses locally sourced ingredients and offers freshly made home cooked foods. There are 26 acres of beautiful grounds to explore, which are full of interesting features and wildlife-friendly display gardens. A network of accessible footpaths weave around the grounds ideal for pushchairs, wheelchairs and little feet! Take a picnic beside their three lakes or search for colourful dragonflies and the



bright blue flash of kingfishers as you stroll alongside the river.

Walk along the boardwalk and enjoy views over tranquil pools, across the River Trent and beyond. Look for the many natural sculptures and willow creations around the grounds in the leafy undergrowth, and there are plenty of benches if you want to sit and enjoy the tranquillity. Stop off in the sensory garden, packed with plants that stimulate your sense of smell, taste, touch, sight and sound, or pick-up ideas for attracting wildlife to your plot in the wildlife garden.

We have visited the Wolseley Centre a couple of times as one of our social events and we can highly recommend a visit to this very tranquil and beautiful gem in our area.

# Sheringham Life Boat Shout from Tuesday 1 August 2023

The service provided at Sheringham is via a volunteer crew, of members who have to report for duty on receiving the notice to launch. In this case the launch was achieved in the remarkable time of six minutes following being called out by Humber Coastguard. Which is even more remarkable when noting that most of the land and sea crew, who serve at the station have other occupations in and around Sheringham. The 10 member crew (as you can see from the report) have a number of duties and work as a team to provide this important services.

This is why the executive Committee of the East Anglian Group Conference take such pride in being given the responsibility to manage the Support fund on behalf of the Oddfellows, which has purchased three Life Boats, to have been launched at the Sheringham Station. The first Oddfellows Life Boat launched was named The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows and was named by Princess Marina, Duchess of Kent on 15 June 1962. The second launch also named The Manchester Unity of Oddfellows took place on 7 August



1994 and was named by the then Grand Master (Chairman of the Society) Brother JW Goulding. The third launch was named The Oddfellows and was named by then Secretary of the Group Conference Sister A Adamson wife of the then Grand Master (Chairman of the Society) Brother K Adamson on 15 September 2007. The next launch is scheduled in around four years and will be called The Oddfellows and it will include the words 'Making Friends, Helping People'. With current inflation rates it is expected that the next launch will cost around £340,000. This leaves us with around £90,000 to raise.

The Mid-Staffs District were very happy to help and to donate £100 to this worthy cause.
