We often hear everyone has a story – it would be lovely to hear yours and I'm offering to help anyone who would like to share their story.

This is my story, just a small part, but what has probably been the most significant part. As a small child, I was inspired of learning about the Olympic Games, not knowing anything of how one could participate. But I had the good fortune of attending a Manchester School where sport played a vital part of its curriculum and where my talent was nurtured. I represented Great Britain in the pentathlon (five events) and the high jump between 1958 and 1970. This enabled me to compete in all major events around the world including two Olympic Games three European Championships and four Commonwealth Games.

An Olympic silver medal being my most acclaimed honour thus fulfilling that childhood dream along with several medals from many other competitions at National and international level. Reflecting on my life in sport I recognise my achievement could not have been possible without the help and support of many people who gave up their time to coach train and officiate at meetings I took part in. Volunteers who willingly encouraged participation in athletics through their own love of the sport. After retirement from international competition, I too became a volunteer to give something back as my mother would have said for the pleasure I had from opportunities and enjoyment afforded to me. I served on local committees to encourage sport for all coaching, organising courses for athletes and mentoring people of all ages and abilities.
