### **Mum's Christmas Pudding Recipe**

#### Ingredients

4oz or 110g of shredded suet 2oz or 50g self-raising flour 4oz or 110g white bread crumbs 1 level teaspoon of ground mixed spice A good pinch of cinnamon 8oz or 225g of demerara sugar 4oz or 110g of Sultanas 4oz or 110g of Raisins 10oz or 275g of Currants 1oz or 25g mixed candied peel loz or 25g of glace' cherries 1oz or 25g almonds skinned and chopped 1/2 an orange zest and juice 1/2 an lemon zest and juice 1 small carrot grated 1 small cooking apple grated 1 table spoon marmalade 2 large eggs 5oz or 250ml of stout

You will need a 2pt or 1.2 litre pudding basin, lightly greased.

#### Method

2 tablespoons of Rum

The day before you want to either steam or boil the pudding take the biggest mixing bowl you have and start by putting in the flour, suet, bread crumbs spices and sugar together mix well, added the dried fruit, the grated apple, carrot the orange and lemon zest and juice and marmalade,.



In a smaller basin mix together the stout rum eggs and beat together. Do not forget to tick everything off so that you know you have used everything bring all the ingredients together and mix well it should fall straight off the spoon so fairly wet, gather all the family round so that they can have a stir and a wish Cover the bowl and leave overnight.

Next day pack the mixture in to the pudding basin put on a sheet of grease proof paper and over the top some baking foil and tie securely with string, put the pudding in a steamer and steam for 6 hours, making sure the saucepan does not boil dry. It is then ready to store I always put new greaseproof paper and foil on once the pudding is cold, it is then ready for Christmas day because of the central heating I store my puddings in the freezer as houses seem too hot to store them in today.

Remove from the freezer and steam for a further 2 and ½ hours on Christmas morning.

This is Winnie Felgate's recipe and a great family favourite.

## Valuable Oddfellows artefact rescued "just in time"!

Clearing out a home often unearths surprises, as members Harold and Jackie Houghton found when they were collecting a pile of discarded items from a relative's home in Manchester.

"We checked to make sure there wasn't anything important left in the pile. Jackie spotted a watch in one of the boxes and she knew I would be interested in taking a look," explained Harold. Having realised they might have an interesting (time)piece of history on their hands, Harold and Jackie visited a horologist (a clock maker), to service the watch.

Harold said: "It wasn't until we moved to Llandudno that I heard any mention of the Oddfellows again. I spotted an advert for a local meeting in Deganwy, so we went along to find out what it was about. We actually joined whilst we were there!" Our resident Oddfellows historian,





Paul Eyre, commented: "The watch is an example of the type of presentation made to a past officer or secretary, usually to mark long service, in the first half of the 19th century. These would have been individually produced and painted by a local craftsman of the time, so this pocket watch is truly a unique piece."

Harold wanted to return the watch to its roots, so he and Jackie visited Manchester's central office to hand-deliver the watch to the CEO and Secretary of the Order, Jane Nelson.

Jane said, "It's wonderful that this watch has brought Harold and his wife to the Oddfellows. We love it when our members share their history with us, and we'll be displaying Harold's kind donation alongside some of our other important historical artefacts."
