Pride of Bournemouth Lionel Brett - Our Centenarian!



On 27 April I joined our Welfare Visitor, Margaret Gibbins on a visit to see Lionel Brett. I had asked Margaret if I could join her on one of her regular visits as Lionel had turned 100 years young in June 2017. Lionel had indicated that he would be happy to meet me and so the visit was organised. What a lovely time I had!

Lionel was born in North Croydon on 2 June 1917. He never knew his parents and was brought up by various foster families. He is a Barnardo's Boy and very proud to be so.

From birth he was looked after by foster parents in Parkstone, a Mr and Mrs Bugler and went to Barnardo's aged 5 and a half. They had to turn their mattresses every day and do chores like washing up, cooking, gardening and sweeping the driveways. He arrived at Dr Barnardo's in Stepney Causeway in London in 1923.

From Barnardos he went to live with foster parents, Mr and Mrs Stannard from March 1923 to June 1931, living in Thwaite, where he slept in a loft, having to go up a ladder to bed as there were no stairs, Wickham Skeith, Mendlesham Green, and Old Newton in Suffolk. He attended Wickham Skeith School and Mendlesham School. Lionel returned to Barnardo's in June 1931, but only for a few days as he was sent out to work for Mr and Mrs Collins to help on their market garden. He has a medal from Barnardo's for good conduct and length of service.

Whilst with Mr and Mrs Stannard his Dad was part of the farming community and taught him many of the country ways of life. In general he helped to groom Suffolk Punch horses and in the spring and summer he used to inform the Romany Gypsies that work was available and helped with lifting sugar beet, swedes etc. He also used to help with the harvest (corn sheaves, stacking and thatching). Lionel's foster father also had an allotment and he was given a small plot to grow similar vegetables - this started to shape his future love for market gardening.

Other interests included singing in the church choir at Wickham Skeith and nature walks in the country with his foster parents. They did this quite often and Lionel was taught a lot about nature in general during the walks. He also used to go on Sunday School outings to Felixstowe and Yarmouth on the old type of Sharabang coaches with the solid tyres and the canvas hoods.

Domestic duties included chopping kindling wood and logs for the fires and shopping for neighbours.

Lionel's employment years included working as a Market Gardener for Mr and Mrs Collins in Strouden, Bournemouth from 1931 - 1933 and for Mr and Mrs Burt from 1933 to 1937. He worked for Voyseys, Bakers from 1937 to 1941 and joined the RAF as a Motor Transport Mechanic in 1941. He was initially posted to Tangmere in Sussex and in late 1942 he was posted to South Africa. However, due to a problem with his eyesight he had to return to England on the Queen Mary and was posted to Bournemouth Airport until a few months prior to the end of the war when he was invalided out. When he was in the Air Force he drove RAF lorries. He had to pass his motor transport mechanic exams and drove coaches to pick up pilots and staff and he transported the officers to the mess. On one occasion a Flying Fortress landed with damaged engines and he had to collect the crew who gave him bananas!

Lionel was married to Dorothy on 31 May 1943 at St Andrew's Church in Bournemouth. They celebrated their Diamond Wedding in 2003. Dorothy died nine years ago.

He then worked for Smith and Co in Boscombe for a short time and then

went back to Market Gardening in 1946 working for Tarrents in a management position until he went self-employed in 1950 when he bought a market garden with his wife, growing all types of vegetables and flowers for 16 years.

During his time as a self-employed market gardener, Lionel also worked at St Leonard's Hospital in Ringwood from 1956 to 1982 as a boiler attendant. During this time he gained his City of London Guilds with credit for boiler operation and maintenance. He looked after seven oil burner boilers and maintained kitchen equipment and fire extinguishers until he retired in 1982.

Lionel's other interests during his life have been cycling, including road racing, hill climbing and dancing. He showed me a certificate from the Bournemouth Arrow Cycling Club that testified to the fact that he had ridden 100 miles in eight hours on 27 October 1935. He was a member of the St John's Ambulance in Bournemouth for three years and had to pass a medical to join. He still has St John Ambulance Certificates dated 1937 and 1938 which he gained having passed examinations to render 'First Aid to the Injured'.

In his retirement years Lionel's main hobbies have been DIY and gardening and he and his wife enjoyed caravanning and coach holidays.

Lionel was very proud to tell me that at 100 years old he only has to take three tablets a day! He had a nose bleed in 1982 that the doctors found very difficult to stop and he was told to drink hot water every day - which he still does. He stopped driving in June after 82 years behind the wheel he decided that he had better stop when he reached 100! He now drives an electric buggy and still helps his neighbours with





their shopping. Lionel is very proud of his lovely garden and was happy for me to take some pictures during my visit.

Lionel's family organised a photograph album for his 100th birthday, which is a wonderful record of his life. On the final page there is a picture of Lionel next to a sign for 'Wickham Skeith' and the statement 'What an adventure!' Lionel told me that he had 'always enjoyed his life'.

It was an absolute privilege to meet Lionel, who was very welcoming and so interesting to talk to. He proudly showed me the framed telegram celebrating his 100th Birthday that he had received from the Oddfellows. Thank you Margaret, for arranging the visit.

A Mid-Week CAMRA Excursion to Lyme Regis

I have been a member of the East Dorset Branch of the Campaign for Real Ale (CAMRA) for about 30 years and in recent years branch members have been out and about on a Wednesday in the middle of the month on 'Don's Spot', alternating between a town (occasionally two adjacent towns) in East Dorset and the following month outside, including visits to Winchester, Worthing and the Isle of Wight. These excursions are 'facilitated' by Don Graham, one of the Branch's founder members, who decides the first port of call where we meet at 12.30pm and stay for an hour before moving-on to the next pub, this starting point having been announced at a Branch Meeting two or three months beforehand. Although he has an itinerary in his mind, this is flexible and occasionally venues are added or deleted in the light of on the day updates re pub closures, new ones opening, changes in opening hours, or changes in the availability of Real Ale.

Thus on Wednesday 20 June a dozen or so intrepid CAMRA members made their way variously by a combination of bus and train to the western extremity of Dorset to informally survey some of the pubs in Lyme Regis. It's a good location for such an exercise as there are seven pubs within a half-mile radius of the centrally-located bus stops, although we only had time to experience three of them. It was also good to meet-up again with the branch's former Chairman, Vernon Shutler, who had travelled down from Okehampton where he now owns and runs his own ciderproducing business and was rewarded with orders for several boxes of Countryman Cider. The bus on which most of us travelled from Bridport to Lyme' was full, standing room only, with six or seven dogs (fortunately all well-behaved) including one which was carried to the upper deck. The bus (which was going through to Axminster) half-emptied at Lyme but almost as many people boarded - a wellused, cross-country service!

Our first port of call was the Royal Lion, just up the hill from the bus stop, and whilst we were there, there was a loud crash from above (the hotel boasts 30 rooms); it transpired that a ceiling had collapsed during spring-cleaning! The real ales available were two from Lyme Regis (Town Mill Best and Lyme Gold) plus two (Ale and Bitter) from the Otter brewery. The food, sampled by Don (Ham Sandwich - somewhat larger than your average - with salad garnish) and the writer (Steak, Ale and Mushroom Suet Pudding with potatoes and vegetables - the little gravy boat on the side was a nice touch), was not the cheapest but still represented good value for money.

Onwards and upwards (Lyme's Broad Street can be compared to Richmond Hill, Bournemouth) to The Volunteer, where Branscombe Vale 'Branoc' was amongst the offerings.

Our last visit in Lyme', partly downhill and just below the bus stop for our return journey, was to Cellar 59 which had 4 Cask Ales available (including two from Gyle 59 - IPA and Emma Broke Mosaic) plus 10 on Key Keg/Top Pressure. (Thank you Chris Allsopp for "sweet talking" Amanda, one of Gyle 59's directors, to open early for us). At this juncture people went their various ways, including Don and about half a dozen others catching the 1557 bus back to Bridport in order to sample the wares at In Pursuit of Hoppiness. Chris and the writer tarried to enjoy the benefits of the Cellar (the writer purchased a bottle each of four different Gyle 59 brews from the bottle store for a tenner), not least Amanda's company, before boarding the 1647 bus (the only later one back to Dorchester is 1845), Don and co getting on at Bridport.

It was an interesting time in Lyme Regis with the Real Ales being acceptable without being remarkable; the consensus of those that broke their return journey was that "Hoppiness" was the best pub of the day. On our return train journey from Dorchester we had the pleasure of the company of 'Tree' (our former Branch Secretary) who happened to board the same train at Wool.
