## Join us for Christmas at Bolesworth Castle

**Join us as we wander through the magical light trail and enjoy the Christmas Market at this wonderful location in Tattenhall, Chester. We will walk along the lakeside with the castle lit up and then wander through the woods where we may even spot a reindeer or two. The trail is 1.2 miles long and travels over bridges and spectacular grounds. You will then be able to purchase food at any of the stands at the Christmas Market.**

Pick-ups will be at Liverpool South Parkway and Wallasey Town Hall and the cost is £30 for adults, £35 for guests and £25 for children aged between 3 and 12 years.

Under 3 go free. There is a Santa's grotto, but let me know if you wish to visit as I will book that for you. There is an additional cost of £5 to visit Santa and you must be aged 3-12 years old. You can leave your Christmas list with him and have your photograph taken as a memento. There is also ice skating at an additional cost of £7 for adults and £5 for children. ## Birkenhead Park Guided Walk

**A few of us ventured back out into the world on Friday 16 July with a visit to the historic Birkenhead Park. We were met by Simon the Ranger, who was to be our guide for the walk. He was full of information and really willing to impart as much as he could to the group. There were eight of us in total and it was a lovely sunny day.**

We started out at the visitor centre in the middle of the park, which was opened in 2006. The design is based on Joseph Paxton's Crystal Palace and was opened by the Duke of Gloucester.

We moved off on our journey through the park and Simon pointed out to us that wherever you are in the park, you can very rarely see the road. The park was

opened on the 5 April 1847 and was the World's first publicly funded Municipal Park. Renowned gardener and architect, Sir Joseph Paxton, designed the park and was supervised by Edward Kemp, who was himself an English Landscape Architect.

The creation of the park was a response to the poor health conditions brought on by the industrial revolution and also represented a vision of what a city of the future could offer society, providing everyone - regardless of class, age race or creed - the opportunity to engage in the beauty of the countryside like surroundings. Birkenhead Park has been the inspiration for the development of several significant urban parks across the world - including Sefton Park in Liverpool and Central Park in New York.

We managed to get round to see the Grand Entrance, the Swiss Bridge (also known as the Chinese Bridge), the Roman Boathouse, the cricket pavilion and the Jackson Memorial drinking fountain. The cricket pavilion was built in 1849 and is one of the earliest surviving cricket pavilions in the country. The cricket club itself was founded in 1846.

During World War II, a spitfire MK2A crashed into the park during a test flight from Hawarden. The pilot, Sergeant Goudie of the Royal Canadian Air Force, lost control and bailed out. In an effort to save lives on the ground, he was aiming for the River Mersey, but it carried on further than expected and buried itself 18 feet deep in the park. Sgt Goudie survived with a sprained ankle and there were no other casualties. The remains of the

spitfire can be seen at Fort Perch Rock in New Brighton.

In 2016, a master plan was developed to build on the success of the restorations already taking place throughout the park. The Roman Boathouse was originally built for small concerts with ambient music playing across the lower lake. This is being built upon and indeed, we can put our hands on our hearts and testify that the acoustics in the boathouse are great, having sung there with my choir.

We were lucky enough to see the geese, swans and cygnets on the lake before ending up back in the café for a well-earned ice cream and sit down, phew!

## Wirral Get Together



## The Oddfellows Annual Movable Conference (AMC)

**As much as we were all hoping for the opportunity to get together and host our 2021 AMC in person, the global pandemic had other plans and so we saw the conference held virtually over Zoom, and broadcast live via YouTube.**

This is only the second time since 1944 that there hasn't been an in-person Annual Movable Conference. The AMC is usually a three-day conference which gives our network of 115 Branches a chance to have their say in the way the Society is run, celebrate its successes and developments over the past 12 months, and enjoy a catch-up with other Branches over dinner.

This year however, the Directors gathered in the Unity Office Boardroom whilst everyone else stayed at home and Deputies logged in via Zoom to listen in and make their contributions to conference.

Despite the distance between us all, the AMC was its usual hive of activity, and thanks go to all the Deputies who attended, debated and voted on the different clauses. We would also like to extend our thanks to the incredible IT team who worked tirelessly to ensure all Deputies were able to log in successfully, the conference was broadcast seamlessly, and everything ran as it should.

## Welcoming our newest Grand Master, David Ogden

**One of the key elements of AMC is the installation of the new Grand Master, or Chairman of the Society. This is the most prestigious and respected roles in the Society, and requires a considerable commitment. As Grand Masters, they need to have progressed through the ceremonial side of the Society and usually will have served for at least four years as a Director, before being nominated to be Grand Master.**

Our Immediate Past Grand Master, David Randall, spent two years in the role, instead of the usual one, due to the coronavirus

pandemic, and has this year welcomed his successor, David Ogden. Despite there being no live audience, the ceremony featuring his installation as Grand Master was streamed on YouTube.
