

Tribute to Neville Chard



Brother Neville was a member of the Manuels Branch which later became the Loyal Acorn Branch. Neville was a member of over seventy years standing and a Ringwood man born and bred. He started his working life as a telegraph boy becoming a postman all his working life. As he was interested in sport, for over fifty years he was the coach and groundsman for Bisterne United Football Club. He continued to still mark out the ground when in his eighties.

Being public spirited Neville was on the Ringwood Town Council from 1973 until 2015. During this period he became the first Mayor of Ringwood and was eventually awarded Honorary Freeman of Ringwood Town, the only person to date to achieve this honour.

After his death the building consortium Linden Homes approached the Town Council to request that the primary road in this large development be named Chard Lane in his memory. His family and partner, Jenny Bursey, were honoured that the dedication Neville gave to Ringwood will be remembered in this way.

Joint Presentation Evening 2018 Brownsea and Pride of Bournemouth

The Pride of Bournemouth Branch were thrilled to welcome the Brownsea Branch members to their Lodge meeting in October, followed by our joint Presentation Evening. During the Presentation Evening the two Branches welcomed representatives from the charities that the members nominated at their Annual Summoned Meetings to support during the year.

This year the two Lodges supported a total of 11 local charities, with the Brownsea Branch also supporting the Orphan Gift Fund and the HA Andrews Memorial Fund. Andrew Hampton, Branch Secretary for the Brownsea Branch was our master of ceremonies, doing the introductions throughout the evening. Each charity had been invited to say a few words during the event after collecting their cheque.

Julie Hampton, Past Chairman of the Brownsea Branch presented the first three cheques. Julie explained that each charity had been chosen by the members because they were close to our hearts. For example, Forest Holme had been nominated because both of Andrew's parents had been cared for there. The Youth Cancer Trust was nominated by one of our elderly members.

Forest Holme Hospice



Paul Tucker, Fundraising and Communications Manager from Forest Holme Hospice, explained that the hospice was based in Poole and was part of the Poole Hospital NHS. They needed £850K extra for nursing posts, equipment, care for families, lymphedema clinic etc. Over 1000 people a year were supported by Forest Holme – all suffering from life limiting and terminal illnesses including Motor Neurone Disease, Parkinsons etc.

Poole Oncology Unit

Maxine Flubacher, Clinical Director of Cancer Services at the Poole Hospital Oncology Unit, told us that she was a consultant for the oncology, chemo and radiotherapy service. They worked closely with Forest Holme. Charitable donations that they receive help to provide the extra things which make the patient's life more tolerable. There was a huge team delivering the care.

Andrew explained about the Oddfellows being linked to The Grove Hotel in Bournemouth and how we are able to send our members suffering with cancer to the Grove for convalescence.



Youth Cancer Trust



Derek Smith, Fundraising and Events Manager from the Youth Cancer Trust explained that they have had a house in Alum Chine for 21 years where children suffering from cancer can enjoy a free holiday. One holiday can cost £900 as travel costs etc are included. They also have speciality weeks eg wellness, yoga, lifestyle choices, and cookery weeks when they visit a boutique chocolate maker. They also have an on-line community where the children can share their experiences with those going through the same thing.

Andrew reminded us that the Chairman of the District, Robert Southam, was raising money to buy a defibrillator which we hoped to possibly locate in the western side of the district. Over the last two years the District Chairman had raised over £4K for Alzheimer's Research. The following eight cheques were presented by Norman Daniels, Chairman of the Pride of Bournemouth Branch. **Alzheimer's Society**



John Major, a volunteer from the Alzheimer's Society, told us that his wife had been diagnosed with Alzheimer's in her early 50s. He was motivated to help and reminded us that it was a sad thing that every few seconds someone is diagnosed. One in three of the people in the room had the dementia clock ticking. Alzheimer's starts 20 years before the symptoms present themselves. Dementia was the most prevalent disease on death certificates, yet there was no cure, no medication and care was not fully funded!

The Alzheimer's Society helps in three areas – support services help sufferers to live better eg singing for the brain etc, raising awareness helps the general public be more aware and research with £150 million going on research. The longer those with the disease can live at home the better their life will be.

Autism Wessex



Tom Johnston, Fundraising Manager from Autism Wessex, told us that Autism was a neuro developmental condition affecting 1 in 100, with 7,000 affected in Dorset. 69 children attended Portfield School and there were 8 residential homes in the Wessex area for adults. The Autism advice service received over 11,000 enquiries within the area. They provided a lifeline for people in really difficult circumstances.

Cherry Tree Nursery

Tish Borrowman, Assistant Manager from Cherry Tree Nursery explained that they ran a therapeutic plant nursery for adults



with mental health problems. They now run a satellite college doing the Royal Horticultural Society Level 1 examination in Practical Horticulture at Cherry Tree with 6 students on the course, including one of our members who was doing really well and was growing in confidence and self-belief. The course had opened doors for the students and the only concession that is made is that they are allowed more time to complete the course – 18 months instead of a year. The 6 students are on schedule with a 100% pass rate so far.

Chesthelp



Mary Brackley, Trustee and Chairman from Chesthelp told us that their charity had been formed in 1947 when TB was rife - and it still is! The TB capital of Europe is London. They help those with TB and COPD. The patient's BMI is usually very low and they need building up. The charity provides milk, eggs etc and winter heating. The patient is usually helped for 6 months and they must build up their BMI for the drugs to work. It costs between £500 and £600 per patient. Mary reminded us that Ernie Fage, Past Grand Master of the Oddfellows, had been a Trustee of the charity for many years and was still well remembered.

Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance



Sue Woollam, a volunteer from the Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance explained that they receive no government or lottery funding but they need 2.5 million per annum - £3K per flight. They responded to 1197 incidents last year, plus 21 critical transfers to hospital. 8-9 call outs per day. They were based in Henstridge and can get anywhere in the area in 20 minutes. The pilots are specially trained and very experienced.

Julia's House



It was wonderful to welcome Reuben Johnston, a Young Ambassador from Julia's House, to receive our cheque on their behalf. Andrew pointed out that Reuben was the youngest recipient that we had every welcomed to our Presentation Evening events.

Reuben explained that his sister had been taken into Julia's House with a rare genetic syndrome. The hospice had helped her greatly and she was now discharged after 9 years. The help they had given her was immense. Reuben said that Julia's House was one of the happiest places to be, a place of pure happiness. Everyone was terrific – they help the children but also the families including siblings and grandparents. They organise residential trips away with people who understand their situation and know the struggles of having a disabled child. They receive 6% of their funding from the government, but 94% has to be donated.

Macmillan Caring Locally



Neal Williams, Trust Secretary from Macmillan Caring Locally, was pleased to be with us once again. He reminded us that they were not connected to Macmillan Cancer Support. Macmillan Caring Locally is based in Christchurch and provided palliative care, similar to Forest Holme. They were the owners and operators of The Grove Hotel and he thanked us for sending patients there. They were not just about providing outstanding care but supporting patients with dignity.

Neal told us about one lady who loved the Red Arrows and they had arranged for her to go to see them at the Bournemouth Air Show, but she was not well enough to go. However, typical of the team they provided a private ambulance who came and took her in her bed to the air show. With pain control she was able to see them with her family and amazing memories were made. Our donation would help facilitate that sort of support.

Poole Heart Support Group



Keith Matthews, Chairman of the Poole Heart Support Group knew that their charity was dear to Norman's heart. Norman had been a member for 8 years and they kept him active! Keith explained that a heart attack usually comes as a bit of a shock but it need not be the end of the world. The NHS gives 8 weeks of support, then patients can join the Heart Support Group. They run 15 courses across the county, each under the control of a trained fitness expert. It costs £1,200 each to train them.

It goes without saying that each recipient was very grateful for the support that the two lodges had been able to give them.

Andrew thanked the 11 recipients for giving up their time for us. We would put the pictures on Facebook and he asked them to link up and 'like' us and promote the Oddfellows if at all possible.



Poole Methodists at the Spire



In 2008 five Methodist Churches in Poole joined together to form Poole Methodists as some of the congregations were too small for them to be viable in the long term. They were Newtown which was converted along with the land into affordable houses and flats. Oakdale now a children's nursery. Ashley Road now the Gateway Church and the hall was demolished and houses built. High Street is the one that was kept and converted into the Spire and Salterns Road now in use for foreign students.

We worshipped at Ashley Road while initial fundraising and sales of properties took place. Coffee Mornings already took place in the old halls at High Street on Tuesdays and Fridays and in 2010 on Saturdays Stop and Snack started. I started selling my hand made cards and later added Bric-a-Brac.

The project was in three parts, the first being converting the church space into Wesley's Café. When the rebuild started the inside of the church was stripped bare, all that was left were the walls, as the space was high a floor was put in. In the downstairs is the café, toilets, rooms that can be used for offices/small meetings and the Chapel which is used Monday to Friday for Together at One, this is a short ecumenical 20 minute service led by various people of different Faiths, it is small but has held 25 at times. The Chapel is open whenever Wesley's is and anyone can access it. Wesley's was opened in early 2015 and I continued selling cards etc. on Saturdays. The second phase meant the old halls were demolished and the new halls, kitchen, meeting room / offices were built. The bottom was fitted out but upstairs, including above Wesleys was left as a shell. In October 2015 the Congregation moved to the downstairs hall for Sunday worship and all associated activities.

The fundraising continued for the third phase. This was started in spring 2018 and is almost complete, it includes the installation of the lift, which has to be large enough to accommodate a coffin. The Church/Community area, now known as The Rose Hall named because of the Rose window at the front is a large area suitable for Church, productions, conferences, bazaars etc. there is another hall, a small kitchen and more offices/ community rooms. We will be moving upstairs in early spring. At the Spire we have several Partners who use our building, including Poole and Parkstone Productions. The whole project has cost over £4 million pounds raised through the sale of buildings, grants and loans from various charities and trusts and our own fundraising. I have raised over £10,000 with my sales.

Afternoon Tea and speaker from the Pain Clinic Pride of Bournemouth

It was a pleasure to welcome Alison, a specialist nurse from the Pain Clinic, a multi-disciplinary pain service for people with persistent pain of over 3 months duration, to our Afternoon Tea in November. Alison was an excellent speaker and we all learned a lot during the afternoon. Alison brought two University students with her who were also charming and all three stayed to enjoy the tea. Many questions were asked and it was interesting to learn that persistent pain affects a third of the population. Their service covers Sherbourne and Weymouth as well as our area. Some of their patients have suffered for years before they are referred to the clinic. They are able to help patients to manage their pain through physio, mindfulness, therapists etc.

Anything stressful can aggravate pain. The reason that the weather often affects our pain is because we are made up of over 60% water, so air pressure changes and our pain is affected. Also bad weather affects our mood, our stress levels and therefore our pain. Alison gave us information leaflets about their service and Margaret, our lodge secretary, has some if you would like a copy.

We would like to thank one of our newer members, Gulsen Hinchley, for suggesting that we invite a speaker from the pain clinic to give us a talk. It was certainly an interesting afternoon and everyone went home having learned something new about 'pain' and the different strategies that are used to cope with it.

On your marks, get set, parkrun

There aren't many things left in life that are free, but one growing phenomenon that is completely gratis is parkrun.

The 5km community events take place in parks each Saturday morning, but parkrun is more than a way of keeping fit, it's a way of making friends, being part of a community, and even inspiration to travel the world.

Parkrun isn't a race. There are no winners, volunteer Tail Walkers ensure that nobody finishes last, and the emphasis is on regular participation rather than performance. There are more than 550 5km courses in the UK and 1,600 across the world, with more than 235,000 adults and juniors taking part on a good weekend globally. Additionally, there are 250 junior parkruns on Sunday mornings for 4-14 year-olds and their families that are 2k in distance.

You don't need to be a top athlete.

At any event you will find parents with pushchairs, dog walkers and people who have never taken part in organised physical activity before. If you use a wheelchair, then you're also welcome, but it's probably worth checking the individual course you fancy doing is accessible with the organisers before setting off.



The events have a great reputation for being friendly and often there's a catch-up after the event at a local café over tea.

It's easy to get started. Register on the website *www.parkrun.org.uk* and you will be given an individual barcode. Print it out and turn up at the event you fancy taking part in. The events all start at 9am in the UK, except for in Scotland and Northern Ireland where they kick off at 9.30am.

If you don't fancy walking or running, then volunteering at the events is a brilliant way to meet people and give back to the community. Each event is self-organising and has its own team of volunteers who would be very pleased to have an extra pair of hands.
