

Bereavement Support Payment

The death of a partner is not only distressing but can also be worrying financially. Bereavement Support Payment is a non-means-tested benefit that people may be able to claim if a spouse, civil partner, or cohabiting partner has died.

There are two different nontaxable rates of Bereavement Support Payment:

- £2,500, followed by 18 monthly payments of £100 if you are not responsible for a child under the age of 20.
- £3,500, followed by 18 monthly payments of £350 if you are responsible for a child under the age of 20.

You can claim Bereavement Support Payment if:

- Your spouse, civil partner, or cohabiting partner died on or after 6 April 2017.
- Your spouse or partner paid National Insurance contributions for at least 25 weeks in a single tax year since 1975.
- You were under state pension age when your spouse or partner died.



 You were living in the UK at the time of death (or another country pays bereavement benefits).

To claim the Bereavement Support Payment, you can either:

- Apply on the government website (apply-for-bereavement-supportpayment.dwp.gov.uk/citizenfrontend/apply)
- Download a claim form on the government website (gov.uk/government/ publications/bereavementsupport-payment-claim-form)
- Phone the Bereavement Service helpline (0800 151 2012).

Member's Recipe - Christmas pudding From Great Aunt Ethel

Great Aunt Ethel had many skills, including baking and making preserves. She collected recipes and wrote them down in her two notebooks. There are several different recipes she collected for Christmas cake and Christmas pudding. The recipe that follows is one for Christmas pudding. Some of the recipes for puddings are mixed with Guinness, some with rum, and some with brandy. What they all share is a very long initial steaming time. Once made, they will keep for months and can be 'fed' with a drop more brandy, port, or rum before the final steaming on the day. This recipe does not use suet.

Ingredients

- 1lb currants (450 gm)
- 1lb sultanas
- 1lb raisins
- 1lb fresh breadcrumbs
- 4oz mixed peel
 - 1lb butter
- 1lb dark brown sugar
- 5 eggs
- 4oz golden syrup
- 6oz self raising flour
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice, 1 teaspoon nutmeg, grated rind and juice of 1 lemon, a wine glass of rum or brandy.

Method

Cream fat and sugar and add eggs. Mix in the rest of the ingredients. Put into greased pudding basins and seal with a double layer of greaseproof paper, tied with string to ensure pudding does not come into contact with water. Place in steamer, or on a upturned saucer in a large saucepan. Fill pan up to half depth of basin with water and steam for 6 hours. You will need to keep an eye on the water level and top up tom prevent pan boiling dry. Keep in a cool dry place until needed and them steam for a further 2 hours or so before serving.



Some members have requested information regarding the care of their pets due to hospitalisation. Did you know that local authorities in England and Wales have a duty to take into their care any pets that cannot be cared for by family or friends when their owner is hospitalised? Under the Animal Welfare Act 2006, local authorities have an obligation to ensure the welfare needs of pets are met while they are responsible for them

(politicalanimal.rspca.org.uk/ england/care-act-emergencyboarding).

As such, local authorities should provide arrangements for the care

and welfare of pets, eg, boarding, as long as their owner is a resident in the area. In Wales, under the Social Services and Wellbeing Act 2014, this also includes individuals with no settled residence but based within the local authority area (politicalanimal. rspca.org.uk/england/care-act-emergency-boarding). This little-known provision can give peace of mind to pet owners at what is already an anxious time.

In addition, The Cinnamon Trust (cinnamon.org.uk) helps older people remain with their pets through a network of volunteers that provide dog walking, fostering and pet care, eg, cleaning of cages and collecting food.

Achieving Together

The married couple from Didcot, Oxfordshire, joined the Oddfellows over half-a-century



ago, and in that time have taken on many voluntary roles, including serving as Branch Chairman five times between them.

They are Welfare Visitors, regularly checking in on around 50 fellow members, and are well known for providing food for events and meetings. They are also responsible for an annual Christmas lunch event which, since 2009, has raised over £2,100 for the HA Andrews Memorial Fund.

Financial worries revealed



Unity Mutual, the Oddfellows' financial services brand, recently surveyed 2,000 people throughout the UK to uncover what's keeping them up at night when it comes to their finances. Here's what they discovered. Do any of these resonate with you?

Cost of living

The worry peaks for those aged 40-49, with 63% feeling the pinch, closely followed by those in their 50s and 60s (both at 62%).

Emergency planning

35% of those surveyed worry they don't have enough money set aside for emergencies like car repairs or medical treatments. Additionally, 28% fret about potential home repair costs.

Pension and retirement

Living on a tight pension is a reality for 22% of respondents, and 18% worry they aren't contributing enough to their pension pot. Many in their 60s regret not paying more into their pensions earlier.



Savings and financial planning

Only 39% of people have money in savings or investments, but this number jumps to 61% for those in their 70s. Yet, just a third have a financial life plan.

Stress and anxiety

Financial stress affects 58% of respondents. Those in their 60s and 70s are less worried compared to younger age groups, with only 35% and 27% respectively reporting anxiety.

Financial regrets

Over half (51%) have financial regrets, including not saving enough each month (46%) and spending on pointless things (43%). Interestingly, more than one in 10 (12%) wish they'd married someone with more money.

These findings show that, while financial worries are largely universal, planning and saving can make a significant difference, especially as we age. Whether you're setting up your first financial plan or adjusting your retirement strategy, it's never too late to take control of your financial future.
