

An Oddfellow for Life

We recently had great pleasure awarding our member 'Roly' Scotney with the District Merit Jewel in recognition of his 60 years membership and service. I went to visit Roly and his wife and asked him about his time with the Oddfellows.

"I joined the Oddfellows in autumn of 1962, not by accident but because of one. I was an apprentice joiner at the time and a combination of a hammer, a nail and my thumb led to my foreman, WP Dawson, remonstrating with me and saying "if you are going to be having accidents like this, you'd better join The Oddfellows!" He was a member himself and explained to me that for 5/- a month I could claim £2 a week from them (on production of a certificate) if I was sick or injured in the future. It seemed an eminently sensible thing to do and I applied, found myself

a referee, some of the committee came to interview me, then my application had to be approved by the committee, then I was visited again by Bertie Batson and he signed me up! It's a bit different to today where you can click a few buttons one day and you are a member the next!

I joined the Providence Lodge 1846 in Oundle which, at the time, had about 200 members – this was of course a men only lodge – the ladies were in Victoria Lodge – and never the twain shall meet! At that time there were almost no social events, the committee met once a month, we had a visit from the Provincial Grand Master (District Chairman) once a year and had an annual lunch! The strong emphasis was on benevolence, acts of kindness to others and the tenets of love, friendship and truth was the backbone of our Lodge.





The Lodge owned many properties within Oundle and these were rented out to people or Oddfellows would provide a mortgage for those who wished to buy a property. I met and married my wife Sylvia and we found a small property owned by the Oddfellows and decided to rent it. So we began our married life under an Oddfellow roof. Children soon followed and when a larger Oddfellows property next door became available we decided that would be our family home. We were offered the opportunity to buy the property in 2000, so we did. It's a lovely bright sunny property, tucked away in a quiet corner and we are still very happy here. My children were made Oddfellows at birth and have remained so, through University and now with children of their own.

I remained a member of Providence Lodge until 1993 when the Lodge was amalgamated with other Lodges and during that time served on the committee and ended up as Secretary (with no secretarial skills whatsoever!). I didn't feel that entering the 'election' for the post of Provincial Grand Master (District Chairman) was something that was meant for me. I was just a humble joiner. I am, however, very proud to be a Trustee of the Nene and Welland Branch'.


I asked Roly what he felt Oddfellows offered to people today.

"Well, you've nothing to lose have you? The first year you pay your fee and get nothing, the second year you get money towards your dentist and glasses which pays you back and pays for your second year – and so it goes on. On top of that you get to go to numerous events, you get companionship, friends and endless free cups of tea!"

Exotic Pet Refuge



The Branch has been delighted to support the refuge and are now in our third year of raising funds for them. During the last two years we have raised almost £5000 despite



the pandemic! We also make regular donations of food and other supplies, kindly donated by our members.

Founded in 1984 by Pam Mansfield and her late husband, Mel, the Exotic Pet Refuge began life in the caring couple's home nine years earlier.

"Someone came to us one day with an injured bird - and it all snowballed from there, with more and more creatures being brought to us! By 1984, we became a registered charity and many years later on we needed to move to our current four acre premises." - Pam, Founder.

A full-time housewife prior to this, Pam also held down many part-time jobs before the refuge demanded every waking hour of her life. Now assisted by her son Darren and a small team of regular volunteers, they now care for over 300 creatures who

will live out the rest of their lives at the refuge - everything from monkeys and snakes to a lynx!

"Caring for this genre of animal is so demanding it requires total dedication from us all. This means that come rain or shine, sickness or tragedy, fear or love, we concentrate on our many residents first. Holidays are a distant memory and we have to take it in turns to go out for the day, but we wouldn't change it for the world - the refuge is our way of life."-Darren, Director.

Costing over £65,000 a year to run, the refuge is extremely grateful to all forms of help offered - be it donations, food, delayed payments or work as a volunteer. Around £20,000 of this money is raised from the six open days every year, where the public are invited to visit the animals at the refuge in order to raise funds to care for them. Upcoming Open days are planned for 17 July, 21 August and 2 October.



"This is a 24/7 job - you don't get time for holidays or any other time off, for instance when an animal is sick it comes into my home for special care. The refuge is my entire life." - Pam Mansfield, Founder.

It's not only the animals who benefit from the Exotic Pet Refuge, however, as many students and people with special learning needs also turn to Pam for work experience. The EPR has also caught the attention of animal enthusiasts Mr Steve Backshall, a presenter of Deadly 60, who in 2006 agreed to be the refuge's patron and Mr Warwick Davis, an accomplished actor, who became refuge's patron in 2013.



How to make an inexpensive gift bag

Materials

½ sheet wrapping paper Double sided tape or glue

Method

1. Measure 1½ from top and fold over and crease well.



2. Fold over to just over half way.



3. Fold the other side, overlapping about ½ inch and stick down (if using wet glue make sure it doesn't go onto the inside of the bag).



4. Fold three inches from the bottom and crease well.



5. Open up the bottom and fold the corners in matching the crease lines.



6. Fold the bottom up to the crease line.



7. Fold down the top of the flap so it overlaps the bottom one by ½ inch and stick together.



8. Fold each side over 1½ inch then turn over and crease again.



9. Carefully open up the bag and use fingers to push out the bottom corners.



10. Make two holes at the top and thread with a ribbon to finish your gift bag.



This bag measure at 11 inches by 7 inches. Any size bag can be made using these instructions, but use good quality wrapping paper for strength.



Access to expert legal help

From day one of membership, all members have access to the Oddfellows' Legal Aid Scheme.*

We hope it's something you never have to call on, but if you do it gives you access to the expert help of our appointed solicitors should you need to make a claim for medical negligence, a personal injury, or an employment dispute which is at pre or tribunal stage. It also covers your family members for personal injury and medical negligence cases.

Help with a medical negligence claim

Medical negligence is when a healthcare provider – NHS or private – has failed in their duty to take care of you and you have suffered an injury. This could be, for example, that you've been given a wrong drug, they've made a mistake during a treatment, or failed to diagnose your condition, or made a wrong one.

Matthew Heap, a Solicitor and Partner at CL Medilaw (www.clmedilaw.co.uk), which is one of the Society's approved solicitors, further explained: "Some people get in touch with us and they know the exact point at which they feel they've been failed. For others, it's less clear-cut, but they know that somewhere along the line, the care they've received has fallen short of medically-acceptable standards.

"Knowing how to raise your case, and to be heard, can be daunting when you don't know the process, have the contacts, or legal knowledge. "But the support that's available through the Oddfellows' Legal Aid Scheme can help you to get the answers you need and, hopefully, the compensation you deserve."

Who can make a claim?

You can bring the legal action yourself or, as the executor or next of kin, on behalf of someone who has died because of medical negligence, or on behalf of a family member if that person is unable to take action themselves because they don't have capacity.

Oddfellows members and their family can receive Legal Aid Scheme support as long as the accident, incident or issue happened while you were a member and you have remained a member since that time.

You must start your legal claim within three years from the date that you either realised you'd been injured or when the incident occurred. For children, this three-year time limit doesn't start until the child's 18th birthday.

If you're looking to make a claim on behalf of someone close to you because they don't have capacity, such as they're unable to manage their own affairs or have a mental disability, then the three-year time limit doesn't apply, unless they recover from this incapacity.

"Taking legal action for compensation is a way to try and secure the support that you now need and deserve – financial or medical. The Oddfellows and CL Medilaw will have your back every step of the way," added Matthew.
